To vacate that portion of alley or easement lying along the line between Lots 20 and 21 of Hansberger, Marion, Beery Company's Seneca Park Place Addition.

Whereas, on the 11th day of October, 1943, the petition and consent of the owner of all the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon that part of the 10 foot alley or easement running in an easterly and westerly direction from Cassady Avenue to Dawson Avenue, the center line of which lays midway between the south line of Seneca Park Place and the north line of Elm Avenue and being so much thereof as lays in and along the line between Lots 20 and 21 of Hansberger, Marion, Beery Company's Seneca Park Place Addition, was duly presented to Council praying that said alley or easement be vacated between said points, and whereas, Council upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for said vacation as prayed for, and that such vacation will not be detrimental to the general interest, and further finds that said petition and consent have been signed by all of the owners of the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said alley or easement between said points, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEKLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That said part of the alley or easement described as follows to-wit:

Being the portion of a ten (10) foot easement running in an easterly and westerly direction from Cassady Avenue to Dawson Avenue, the center line of said easement laying midway between the south line of Seneca Park Place and the north line of Elm Avenue, and being so much thereof as lays in and along the line between Lots 20 and 21 of Hansberger, Marion, Beery Company's Seneca Park Place Addition,

be, and the same is hereby vacated; reserving, however, to the City and public and quasi-public corporations now or hereafter holding franchises or permits from the City for the supplying of water, gas, electricity, and telephone service, all necessary easements in, under or over said alley or easement, for the purpose of maintaining, replacing, repairing and servicing any sewers, manholes, poles, conduits, wires or anchors now in or on said portion of said alley or easement.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

To vacate the first alley north of Main Street extending from Parkview Avenue to the first alley east of Parkview Avenue.

Whereas, on the 12th day of May, 1942, a petition and consent of the persons owning all the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the first alley north of Main Street extending from Parkview Avenue to the first alley east of Parkview Avenue was duly presented to council praying that said alley be vacated between said points, and whereas, council upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for said vacation as prayed for, and that such vacation will not be detrimental to the general interests, and further finds that said petition and consent have been signed by all of the owners of the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said alley between said points, NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That said first alley north of Main Street extending from Parkview Avenue to the first alley east of Parkview Avenue, in the City of Bexley, be and the same is hereby vacated; reserving, however, to the City and public and quasi public corporation now or hereafter holding franchises and permits from the city for the supplying of water, gas electricity, and telephone service, all necessary easements in, under or over said alley, for the purpose of sewers, mains, poles, wires and conduits, and maintaining and keeping them in repair, so far as the city may deem to be necessary, to supply its inhabitants with public utility service, sewers and drains.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
