ORD. No. 2-63—To accept the plat of the Goodale Slum Clearance Project to be called Goodale Urban Renewal Plat No. 1, and to declare an emergency.

Whereas, the City of Columbus has undertaken the Goodale Slum Clearance Project and has in Ordinance No. 135-57, passed October 29, 1957, and in Ordinance No. 481-61 passed April 19, 1961, indicated its intention to replot the area of the Goodale project including all easements necessary to properly serve the area; and

Whereas, the City has entered into an agreement with the United Redevelopment Corporation and the Board of Education to sell certain land within this project area including streets and alleys heretofore vacated; and

Whereas, it is immediately necessary to accept and dedicate to public use the streets and easements reserved there indicated on the plat in order to read certain land to the United Redevelopment Corporation and to the Board of Education, and record the plat for record in the Franklin County Recorder's Office, the necessity for which has created an emergency in the usual daily operation of the Department of Urban Renewal and is therefore immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, property, health and safety; now therefore;

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the plat of the Goodale Urban Renewal Project, identified as The Goodale Urban Renewal Plat No. 1, situate in the State of Ohio, County of Franklin, City of Columbus, being a resubdivision of parcels conveyed to the City of Columbus, together with certain streets and alleys vacated by Ordinance Nos. 883-61, 292-62, 627-62, 698-62, and 1-63, all of which are a part of "R.
