All classified officers and employees now employed in the division of traffic regulation under the provisions of said ordinances 38840, 100-32, 216-32 and 223-32, shall continue in such or like offices and positions under the civil service rules, and all additional officers and employees provided for herein shall be appointed by the director of public safety pursuant to the city charter, rules of the city civil service commission, and ordinances of city council, so far as the same may apply.

Sec. 2. Duties of traffic engineer. It shall be the duty of the traffic engineer to conduct studies of street traffic accidents and congestion, and other conditions affecting the safe and convenient use of the streets; to collect facts regarding the effect and operation of regulations controlling street traffic; to supervise the placing, maintenance and operation of traffic signs, traffic signals and traffic control signals, and to perform such other duties in connection with traffic regulation as may be ordered by the director of public safety.

Sec. 3. That ordinance No. 38840, passed March 5, 1928; ordinance No. 100-32, passed February 1, 1932; ordinance No. 216-32, passed March 25, 1932, and ordinance No. 223-32, passed April 4, 1932, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 98-34—To fix the salaries of the officers of the subdivision of public welfare and to repeal ordinances Nos. 232-33, passed July 31, 1933, and 29-34, passed January 15, 1934.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the subdivision of public charity in the division of public welfare of the city in that it is necessary to reorganize the division to conform with an order of the civil service commission; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the salaries of the officers and employees of the subdivision of public charities in the division of public welfare, be and the same are hereby fixed as follows:

That senior case workers, junior case workers and investigators in the division of charities, department of public safety, permitted to use private automobiles in city business will be allowed in addition \$10 per month to their regular salary, and may use the gasoline and oil furnished by the city, while upon the public business of the department of charities, division of public safety, from the sup-

plies purchased by the city of Columbus as used and paid for by other departments of the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Sec. 3. That ordinances Nos. 232-33, passed July 31, 1933, and 29-34, passed January 15, 1934, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 100-34—To appropriate an additional \$2000 to pay the cost of continuing the work of making soil tests.

Whereas, council by ordinance No. 334-33, passed November 20, 1933 and ordinance No. 15-34, passed January 8, 1934, authorized the director of public service to employ the services of a reputable core drilling concern, at a rate not to exceed \$2.50 per linear foot, in connection with the design and construction of sewers under the provisions of the National Industrial Recovery Act, and appropriated \$2000 to pay the cost thereof, and

Whereas, the funds appropriated were inadequate; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the additional sum of \$2000 or so much thereof as may be needed, be and it is hereby appropriated to carry on the work of making core borings to determine the nature of the soil to be encountered in the construction of sewers under the National Industrial Recovery Act.

Hopple as a member of the utilities commission of Ohio by reason of certain utterances attributed to him in the public press, and

Whereas, said E. J. Hopple has since filed with the governor of Ohio a repudiation of said utterances so attributed to him, and

Whereas, the governor of Ohio pursuant to said repudiation of said public utterances so attributed to said E. J. Hopple has refused to remove the said E. J. Hopple, and

Whereas, said E. J. Hopple, notwithstanding said repudiation of said public utterances, has by his public acts as a member of the public utilities commission of Ohio, given grounds for a widespread belief over the state of Ohio that if he did not deliver the remarks attributed to him, his policy as a member of the commission has been of the kind and character described by him in said public utterances and that said public utterances so attributed to him correctly define his attitude on utility questions, and

Whereas, for the reasons aforesaid said E. J. Hopple has lost the public confidence as an impartial arbitrator in public utility matters; now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Columbus:

That we reiterate our demand that the governor remove said E. J. Hopple as a member of the public utilities commission of Ohio and that we cooperate with all lawful means to remove said E. J. Hopple as a member of the said public utilities commission, and that a copy of this resolution be sent to all municipalities in the state of Ohio, requesting their co-operation in all lawful means to remove said E. J. Hopple as a member of the public utilities commission of Ohio.
