

receipts for the year preceding, which report shall be verified by the affidavit of the president or superintendent of said company, and the director of accounts of said city is hereby authorized at any time, when in his judgment it may be necessary, to verify said report by a personal inspection of the books and papers of said company showing the gross receipts thereof.

And said company in further consideration for the franchise hereinbefore granted shall be required to furnish all public lighting for said city of Columbus upon any of the streets and alleys of said city, as required by the city council thereof, at a sum and price not greater than that heretofore paid for such service by said city to said company, upon the schedule as to the time and condition of lighting heretofore made and embodied in the contract between the city and said company.

That as long as said schedule, now embraced in said contract, shall remain and be established by the city council of said city or the board of public works thereof, should no greater service be required of said company than that embraced in said schedule, said price per lamp shall not exceed for any portion of the term for which this franchise is granted the price now paid and set forth in the contract hereinbefore referred to.

This ordinance is granted to said company on the terms and conditions hereinbefore and hereinafter set forth, and in case said company, its successors and assigns should at any time during the continuance of this franchise fail to comply with the terms and conditions hereinbefore recited, then this ordinance shall be held null and void and all rights of said company thereunder shall cease and be of no effect.

SEC. 4. This ordinance shall take effect when said company shall have filed with the city clerk a written acceptance of the same and from and after its publication according to law.

AN ORDINANCE—No. 10163. ✓

Accepting David E. and Cora J. Neereamer's subdivision.

SECTION 1. *Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Columbus, O.,* That David E. and Cora J. Neereamer's subdivision of parts of lots Nos. 38 and 39 of H. T. Chittenden's Woodburn addition be and the same is hereby approved and accepted, and the streets and alleys as shown on plat of subdivision not heretofore dedicated, are hereby declared public highways of the city of Columbus.

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication according to law.

AN ORDINANCE—No. 10212. ✓

To vacate a portion of Williams street from Twentieth street to Twenty-second street.

WHEREAS, On the 18th day of March, 1895, a petition was presented to the city council for the vacation of certain portions of a street running from Twentieth street east to Twenty-second street, first street south of Long and known as Williams street, notice of the pendency and prayer of which petition has been duly given as required by law; and

WHEREAS, Upon hearing the council is satisfied that there is just cause for such vacation, and that the same would not be detrimental to the general interest and should be made; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Columbus, O.,* That on each side of Williams street, above described, a strip of land between the lot line of lots abutting upon said street and a line drawn three feet inside of the curbing on each side of said street be vacated by the said city and no longer used or held for use as a public highway, or for the purpose for which said street was dedicated.

SEC. 2. For the expense of advertising this ordinance and for all other expenses connected with the vacating of the land herein described the city shall be reimbursed by the owners of property adjacent to the land vacated. And nothing herein contained shall be deemed to give the said property owners a right to enter upon said lands so vacated until said costs are paid to and receipted for by the director of accounts.

SEC. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and due publication according to law.

AN ORDINANCE—No. 10161. ✓

Accepting Mary Dodge's subdivision in the City of Columbus, Ohio.

SECTION 1. *Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Columbus, O.,* That Mary Dodge's subdivision of lot No. 17 and the west part of lot No. 12, of Thomas Miller's heirs' subdivision, be and the same is hereby approved and accepted; streets and alleys as shown on the plat of said subdivision not heretofore dedicated are hereby declared public highways of said city.

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.

AN ORDINANCE—No. 10126. ✓

Accepting John Zuber's subdivision.

SECTION 1. *Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Columbus, O.,* That John Zuber's subdivision of part of lots Nos. 45, 46 and 47 of Deshler, Thurman & Bennett's subdivision, be and the same is hereby approved and accepted, and the streets and alleys as shown on the plat of subdivision not heretofore dedicated are hereby declared public highways of the city of Columbus.

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.

AN ORDINANCE—No. 10160.

To regulate the hours of work for mechanics, workingmen and laborers in the employ of the municipal corporation therein or otherwise engaged in public works within the city.

SECTION 1. *Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Columbus, O.,* That on and after the passage of this ordinance, eight hours out of twenty-four of each day shall make and constitute a legal day's work for mechanics, workingmen and laborers while in the employ of the municipal corporation of Columbus, Ohio, and also for mechanics, workingmen and laborers while engaged on public works of said city under contracts, wherein such contracts provide for and regulate the hours of labor thereon.
