AN ORDINANCE No. 1032-61 — To vacate certain streets, alleys and easements, between specified limits, within the boundary lines of the municipal airport; to repeal Ordinance No. 641-61, passed May 15, 1961; and to declare an emergency.

Whereas, the streets and alleys are located within the boundary lines of the municipal airport and are needed in order to allow for the planned construction of runways and utilities, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Service, in that the streets and alleys should be vacated so that the work may proceed without delay, thereby preserving the public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following streets and alleys, between the points named, be and the same are hereby vacated:

All streets, excepting Fourteenth Avenue, within the boundary lines of H. M. Boyd's Addition, as said addition is of record in Plat Book 21, page 25, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio:

All of Marellen Avenue, from the north line of 14th Avenue to its north terminus, and from the south line of 14th Avenue to the north line of Ruth Avenue;

All of Doresther Avenue, from the north line of 14th Avenue to its north terminus, and from the south line of 14th Avenue to the north line of Ruth Avenue;

All of Rosewood Avenue, from the north line of 14th Avenue to its north terminus, and from the south line of 14th Avenue to the north line of Ruth Avenue;

All of Ruth Avenue, from the east line of said H. M. Boyd's Addition westwardly to its west terminus.

All streets and alleys, excepting Seventeenth Avenue, within the boundary lines of Roseland Gardens Subdivision, as said subdivision is of record in Profile Book 19, page 15, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio:

All of Marellen Avenue, from the north line of 17th Avenue to the north line of said subdivision, and from the south line of 17th Avenue to the south line of said subdivision;

All of Doresther Avenue, from the north line of 17th Avenue to the north line of said subdivision, and from the south line of 17th Avenue to the south line of said subdivision;

All of Rosewood Avenue, from the north line of 17th Avenue to the north line of said subdivision, and from the south line of 17th Avenue to the south line of said subdivision;

The alley east of Stelzer Road, from the north line of 17th Avenue to the north line of said subdivision, and from the south line of 17th Avenue to the south line of said subdivision;

The alley north of 17th Avenue, from the east line of the alley east of Stelzer Road to the west line of Marellen Avenue, and from the east line of Marellen Avenue to the west line of Doresther Avenue from the east line of Doresther Avenue to the west line of Rosewood Avenue;

The alley south of 17th Avenue, from the east line of Marellen Avenue to the west line of Doresther Avenue, and from the east line of Doresther Avenue to the west line of Rosewood Avenue.

All streets and alleys within the boundary lines of Englewood Heights Subdivision, south of Oakland Avenue, as said subdivision is of record in Plat Book 18, page 60, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio:

All of Willa Drive, from the north line of South Avenue to the north
