AN ORDINANCE No. 1039-55—To grant the Scioto Savings and Loan company, a corporation, the right and privilege to install, operate and maintain an electrically controlled time and temperature indicator in the sidewalk space, in front of its building known as 190 South High Street.

Whereas, the Scioto Savings and Loan company, a corporation, is the owner of the property located at the northeast corner of High street and Walnut street, being a part of lot No. 342 and known as 190 South High street, and said owner has requested the right and privilege to install, operate and maintain an electrically controlled time and temperature indicator in the sidewalk space on High street in front of said property, and

Whereas, such installation, operation and maintenance will not be detrimental to the interests of the general public; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the right and privilege to install, operate and maintain an electrically controlled time and temperature indicator in the sidewalk space, in front of building at 190 South High street, is hereby granted to the Scioto Savings and Loan company, a corporation, its successors and assigns, and such right and privilege shall include the installation of the necessary conduits to house the electrical wires. Said indicator shall be approximately 6 feet and 3 inches in height, 5 feet and 3 inches in width, the outer edge of which shall be located approximately 1 foot east of the east curb line, with a clearance of not less than 12 feet above the sidewalk elevation, and shall be mounted upon a steel post located approximately 2 feet and 1½ inches east of the east curb line and 23 feet north of the north line of Walnut street, and shall in no way interfere with any public or privately owned utilities.

Sec. 2. The said Scioto Savings and Loan company, a corporation, its successors and assigns, shall save the city free and harmless from any and all damages which may arise or grow out of the installation, use or maintenance of said indicator and, in the event such installation interferes with any future improvement, or improvements, to be made by the city of Columbus, said the Scioto Savings and Loan company, its successors and assigns, shall relocate or remove said indicator, without cost or expense of any nature to the city, the occupation of the space in and above said sidewalk by such indicator being permitted merely as an accommodation and no right, title or interest of the general public being abridged in any way thereby; and further, said company shall pay the cost of the publication of this ordinance.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law and upon the filing by the Scioto Savings and Loan company, with the clerk of this council, its acceptance, in writing, of each and all of the terms, provisions and requirements hereof; provided, however, that if said company shall fail to file such written acceptance within thirty days after the passage thereof, then the same shall be void and of no force and effect.

AN ORDINANCE No. 1043-55—To vacate the alley east of Brookside drive, extending from the alley south of Main street to Mound street.

Whereas, petition signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley east of Brookside drive, extending from the alley south of Main street to Mound street, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the limits specified, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for said vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley east of Brookside drive, extending from the south line of the alley south of Main street to the north line of Mound street, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley hereby vacated, and does further reserve unto itself perpetual easement for the full width of the alley for the purpose of installing or constructing any new utility facilities, either publicly or privately owned, which may become necessary, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of constructing, installing, replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
