ORD. No. 1058-76—To vacate the first alley west of Parkwood Avenue, from Granville Street to first alley south of Granville Street.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley west of Parkwood Avenue, from Granville Street to the alley south of Granville Street, was duly presented to this Council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points mentioned, and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the first alley west of Parkwood Avenue, extending from the south line of Granville Street to the north line of the first alley south of Granville Street, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Section 2. That the City of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the City, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

ORD. No. 1059-76—To authorize the payment of the 1976-77 membership dues of the City of Columbus in the Airport Operators Council, Inc. in the amount of \$3,500.00.

ORD. No. 1064-76—To authorize the Director of Finance to enter into contract for Cost Control Services in the areas of Workmen's Compensation and Unemployment Compensation, and to authorize the expenditure of \$45,000.00 from Dept. No. 218, General Miscellaneous, Fund No. 0100, Major Code 300, and to declare an emergency. (\$45,000)

Whereas, it has been determined to be in the best interests of the City of Columbus to solicit requests for proposal in the areas of Workmen's Compensation and Unemployment Compensation from interested parties; and

Whereas, several proposals were received and evaluated by the Department of Finance, City of Columbus and a determination has been made as to the bidder whose proposal is most advantageous to the City of Columbus, price and other factors considered; and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the Department of Finance in that it is immediately necessary to contract for Cost Control Services for the City in the areas of Workmen's Compensation and Unemployment Compensation and thereby preserving the public peace, health, property, safety and welfare; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Director of Finance is hereby authorized to enter into contract for Cost Control Services in the areas of Workmen's Compensation and Unemployment Compensation with R. E. Harrington, Inc., compensation cost control consultants, for a period of twelve months beginning July 1, 1976, and to authorize the expenditure of \$45,000.00 or as much thereof that is needed for said contract, to be appropriated from Fund No. 0100, Department No. 218—General Miscellaneous, Code 300.

Section 2. That the sum of \$45,000 be and is hereby appropriated from Dept. No. 218, General Miscellaneous, Fund No. 0100, Major Code 300 to pay the cost thereof.

Section 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor, or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

ORD. No. 1103-76—To accept the application for the annexation of certain territory containing 14.6 ± acres in Franklin Township.

Whereas, a petition for the annexation of certain territory in Franklin Township was duly filed by White-Westinghouse Corporation; and

Whereas, the said petition was duly considered by the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, April 14, 1976; and

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners has approved the annexation of the said territory to the City of Columbus as hereinafter described; and

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners certified the transcript of the proceedings in connection with the said annexation with the map and petition required in connection therewith to the City Clerk who received the same on April 22, 1976; and

Whereas, sixty days from the date of said filing have now elapsed in accordance with the provisions of §709.04 of the Revised Code; and

Whereas, it is in the best interest of the City of Columbus to accept the annexation of the territory sought to be annexed by the aforesaid petition; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the proposed annexation as applied for in the petition of White-Westinghouse Corporation, being the majority of the owners of real estate in such territory sought to be annexed and filed with the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, on February 12, 1976, in which said petitioner prayed for annexation to the City of Columbus, Ohio, of certain territory adjacent thereto as hereinafter described, and which said petition was approved for annexation to

the City of Columbus by the Board of County Commissioners on April 14, 1976, be and the same is hereby accepted and said territory is hereby annexed to the City of Columbus. Said territory is described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the existing City of Columbus Corporation Line (Ordinance No. 1654-56, Miscellaneous Record 98, Page 601, said point being the northeasterly corner of the R. Wiefel 0.393 acre tract, and at a corner of the WCI-Westinghouse, Inc. 298.066 acre tract;

Thence in a westerly direction, along a northerly line of said 0.393 acre tract, and along the northerly line of the R. Wiefel 0.536 acre tract, a distance of 122 feet, more or less, to a point at the northwesterly corner of said 0.536 acre tract;

Thence in a southerly direction, along the westerly lines of said 0.536 acre tract and said 0.393 acre tract, a distance of 448 feet, more or less, to a point in the northerly right-of-way line of West Broad Street (U.S. Route No. 40—National Road);

Thence in a westerly direction along the northerly right-of-way line of said West Broad Street and across the said 298.066 acre tract, a distance of 800 feet, more or less, to a point;

Thence in a northerly direction across said 298.066 acre tract, a distance of 750 feet, more or less, to a point;

Thence in an easterly direction across said 298.066 acre tract; a distance of 790 feet to a point in the centerline of Dry Run Creek;

Thence continuing in an easterly direction across said 298.066 acre tract, and along the centerline of said Dry Run Creek, a distance of 136 feet, more or less, to a point in said existing City of Columbus Corporation Line, and in an easterly line of said 298.066 acre tract;

Thence in a southerly direction along said existing City of Columbus Corporation Line, and along an easterly line of said 298.066 acre tract, a distance of 272 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning, containing 14.6 acres, more or less.

Section 2. That the City Clerk be and she is hereby authorized and directed to make three copies of this ordinance to each of which shall be attached a copy of the map accompanying the petition for annexation, a copy of the transcript of proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners relating thereto, and a certificate as to the correctness thereof. The City Clerk shall then forthwith deliver one copy to the County Auditor, one copy to the County Recorder, and one copy to the Secretary of State and shall notify the Board of Elections thereof, and do such other things as may be required by law.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORD. No. 1108-76—To authorize an appropriation of \$291,911.00 from the unappropriated funds in the East West Code Enforcement Fund, Fund No. 0294, to Dept. No. 950, Urban Renewal, Major Code 500 to provide funds necessary to satisfy an audit adjustment in the Ohio E-1, East West Code Enforcement Project, and to declare an emergency. (\$291,911)
