ORD. No. 98-65—To enter into a contract for the promotion and publicizing of the City of Columbus and to appropriate moneys to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, it is necessary to be ever mindful of the need for promoting and publicizing the City of Columbus; and

Whereas, the citizens and business community of Columbus profit financially and culturally from such promotion; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Clerk of the City of Columbus, Ohio, be and he is hereby authorized to execute a contract with the Columbus Convention Bureau, Inc. for and on behalf of the City of Columbus in the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) for the purpose of having the Columbus Convention Bureau, Inc. publicize and promote the City of Columbus, Ohio, to bring the patronage and business of cultural, educational, religious, professional, and sports organizations into the City for the benefit of the citizens and the business community.

Sec. 2. That for the purpose of paying the cost thereof, the sum of \$10,000.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated from Department 010, Code 430.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORD. No. 107-65—To vacate that part of Lisle Alley (Alley west of Wager Street), beginning at the north line of Lot No. 29 extended and extending southwardly to the south line of Lot No. 30 of Al Thurman's Subdivision, a distance of 50.6 feet.

ORD. No. 108-65—To name the Service Road, extending along the west boundary of the East Innerbelt, from Main Street to Town Street and from Town Street to Oak Street, Lester Drive.

Whereas, Mrs. Lester Anderson has suggested the roadway, connecting Oak Street and Main Street on the west side of the East Innerbelt, be named in memory of her late husband, and her late husband being former owners of property now occupied by the roadway, and

Whereas, it is in the public interest that such roadway be named; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Service Road, shown upon Sheets 37 and 38 of the East Innerbelt Plans (FRA 62-1530), extending along the west boundary of said East Innerbelt, from Main Street to Town Street and from Town Street to Oak Street, be and the same is hereby named Lester Drive.
