(\$150,000)

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Human Services desires to enter into a contract with the Community Shelter Board, Inc. to provide monies for the provision of emergency shelter for homeless persons in the metropolitan Columbus area, and

WHEREAS, funds will be provided from the Emergency Human Services Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Community Shelter Board, Inc. will coordinate and fund programs providing emergency shelter to homeless persons in Franklin County, and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Human Services in that it is immediately necessary to authorize the Director to enter into a contract with the Community Shelter Board, Inc. for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare; and now, therefore;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF

THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

Section 1. That the Director of the Department of Human Services is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with the Community Shelter Board, Inc. to provide coordination and funding of programs providing emergency shelter to homeless persons in Franklin County for the period February 16, 1991 through February 15, 1992.

Section 2. That for the purpose as stated in Section 1, the expenditure of \$150,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is hereby authorized to be expended from the Department of Human Services, Dept. No. 41-01 Subfund 02-232 Character 03, Minor Object 337 and Index Code 410159.
