ORD. No. 1108-75—To vacate Bolivar Street, Hildreth Avenue and alley south of Atcheson Street, between specified limits; and to declare an emergency.

Whereas, request has been made by Community Development and Urban Renewal for the vacation of Bolivar Street, Hildreth Avenue and alley south of Atcheson Street, between specified limits in Mt. Vernon Plaza Renewal Project, and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacations as requested, that they will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Service, Division of Street Maintenance and Repair, in that such vacations should be made immediately in order for the project to proceed, thereby preserving the public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That Bolivar Street, extending from the north line of Mt. Vernon Avenue to the south line of Atcheson Street;

Whereas, it is the further request of the Federal Aviation Administration that Section 1 of Ordinance No. 1013-75 state in fact that said Grant Agreement is attached to and incorporated by reference as part of this ordinance; and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operations of the Divisions of Airports, Department of Public Service in that it is immediately necessary to include the aforementioned statement as part of Section 1 of Ordinance No. 1013-75 without delay and for the preservation of the public peace, property and safety; now therefore

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 1013-75 passed June 9, 1975 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. That the City of Columbus, Ohio shall enter into a Grant Agreement for the purpose of obtaining Federal Aid in the Development of Port Columbus International Airport. Such Grant Agreement consists of "Contract No. DOT-FA75-GL-7566" of "Part I—Offer" and "Part II—Acceptance." Said Grant Agreement is attached to and incorporated herein by reference as part of this ordinance.

Section 2. That existing Section of Ordinance No. 1013-75 passed June 9, 1975 be and it is hereby repealed.
