AN ORDINANCE No. 1172-52—To declare the intention of the city to acquire property to be dedicated to public use for street purposes, and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, negotiations have been had for the acquisition of two parcels of land to be dedicated to public use for the widening and extending of Eakin road; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That it is hereby declared the city of Columbus, Ohio, intends to acquire the hereinafter described parcels of land to be dedicated to public use for the widening and extending of Eakin road, from Racine avenue to the alley west of Harris avenue:

Parcel No. 1.

Situated within the corporate limits of the city of Columbus, Franklin county, Ohio, and being a tract of land out of reserve "E" of the subdivision of reserve "D", Wilshire Heights addition, as the same is of record in plat book 21, page 4, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the west line of Harris avenue, said point being located 61.00 feet northerly of the southeast corner of said reserve "E" and the northeast corner of lot No. 1 of block No. 10 of Wilshire Heights addition; thence westwardly with a line parallel to said south line of reserve "E" and the north line of said lot No. 1, a distance of 155.96 feet to a point in the east line of the alley west of Harris avenue; thence northwardly with said east line of said alley, a distance of 55.00 feet to a point; thence eastwardly a distance of 156.33 feet to a point in the west line of Harris avenue, said point being 111.00 feet northerly of the southeast corner of said reserve "E"; thence southwardly with said west line of Harris avenue, a distance of 50.00 feet to the place of beginning, containing 0.19 acres, more or less.

Parcel No. 2.

Being a triangular tract of land off of the north end of reserve "A" of Brookshire Park addition, as the same is of record in plat book 22, page 67, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the east line of Harris avenue, said point being 25.00 feet southerly of the southeast corner of Harris avenue and Eakin road and the northwest corner of said reserve "A"; thence northwardly with the said east line of Harris avenue, a distance of 25.00 feet to the said southeast corner of Harris avenue and Eakin road; thence eastwardly with the south line of Eakin road, a distance of 276.19 feet to the northeast corner of said reserve "A"; thence westwardly with a line which bears south

of the south line of Eakin road, a distance of 277.34 feet to the place of beginning, containing 0.08 acres, more or less.

That from the unappropriated monies now in the maintenance and repair No. 65 fund, and from any and all monies anticipated to come into said fund during the period ending December 31, 1952, the sum of \$4,100 be and it is hereby appropriated to the maintenance and repair No. 65-500 fund to pay the cost thereof.

AN ORDINANCE No. 1174-52—To authorize and direct the director of public service of the city of Columbus, Ohio, on behalf of the city of Columbus, to enter into agreements to extend the termination date of sewerage service agreements now in effect, with the General Motors Corporation (Ternstedt Division), the city of Bexley, Ohio, the Village of Whitehall, Ohio, the Village of Riverlee, Ohio, the Village of Marble Cliff, the Village of Hanford, Ohio, the Village of Worthington, Ohio, and the Village of Valleyview, Ohio, which agreements provide for the transportation, pumping and treatment by the sewerage system and sewage treatment works of the city of Columbus, of sanitary sewage, and

Whereas, the city of Columbus is contemplating a revision of the schedule of sewerage service rates of charge, and such revised schedule can not be made effective until after the above-mentioned agreements have expired, and

Whereas, under the provisions of present controlling ordinances, there is no authority providing for such agreements to be made or extended for periods of time of less than two years, and

Whereas, it is considered to be desirable to extend the current agreements, which terminate December 31, 1952, to the effective date of the new rate ordinance at which time, new full term agreements will be required, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of sewerage and drainage, department of public service, in that provision must be made to continue sewerage service to and collection of sewerage service charges from the General Motors Corporation and the several political subdivisions hereinabove referred to, for the immediate preservation of public property, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service of the city of Columbus, Ohio, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into agreements to extend the sewerage service agreements now in effect with the General Motors Corporation (Ternstedt Division), the city of Bexley, Ohio, the Village of Whitehall, Ohio, the Village of Riverlee, Ohio, the Village of Marble Cliff, Ohio, the Village of Hanford, Ohio, the Village of Worthington, Ohio, and the Village of Valleyview, Ohio, in order that said agreements will not terminate on December 31, 1952 and that the provisions and stipulations therein, may be continued in effect until such time as a proposed revised schedule of rates of charge becomes effective.

Sec. 2. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 1175-52—To authorize and direct the board of purchase to purchase on the open market, without advertising for bids, for plant material consisting of 110 trees and heavily rooted willow like shrubs for the preservation of the dike at the Columbus Zoo and to appropriate the funds thereof.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of zoo, department of public service, No. 80, in that the purchase of this plant material, consisting 110 trees and heavily rooted willow like shrubs is immediately necessary for the preservation of the dike at the Columbus Zoo in order to stop erosion of the dike, and that this material is immediately necessary so that it can be planted while the river is at a low level therefore preventing any storm damage and for the preservation of public property, welfare and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to purchase on the open market without advertising for bids for plant material consisting of 110 trees and heavily rooted willow like shrubs for the preservation of the dike at the Columbus Zoo in accordance with the specifications to be on file in the office of the board of purchase, for the division of Zoo, No. 80, department of public service.

Sec. 2. That the sum of approximately \$1,200, or as much thereof as may be needed, be and the same is hereby appropriated from the monies in the fund known as the "Municipal Zoo, land, building and equipment Fund No. 2—Code 602," to pay the cost thereof.
