Section 1. That the plat of Dedication of Caldwell Place and Utility Easements in Bolivar Arms, lying north of Leonard Avenue and west of Bolivar Street, be and the same is hereby accepted.

ORD. No. 1203-64—To authorize the Director of Public Service to secure the assistance of private contractors and construction firms in furnishing labor or labor and material necessary to make new water taps

from ¾ inch to 2 inch, inclusive, by securing estimates and not advertising for competitive bids and to declare an emergency.

Whereas, due to the tremendous increase in new construction, the Division of Water does not have sufficient personnel or equipment to meet the demand for new water taps, and

Whereas, it is necessary to request authorization for the Director of Public Service to be authorized to secure the assistance of private contractors and construction firms to assist Water Works personnel in making new taps by receiving quotations for furnishing labor or labor and material for installing various size taps from ¾ inch to 2 inch, inclusive, at the discretion of the Director of Public Service, without advertising for bids, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Water, Department of Public Service, in that it is immediately necessary to authorize the Director of Public Service to secure assistance from private contractors or private construction firms to furnish labor or labor and material necessary to install new water taps, as the Division of Water does not have sufficient personnel or equipment to meet the demand, and is now sixty days behind schedule for the immediate preservation of public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore, Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Service is hereby authorized and directed to secure the services of private contractors or private construction firms to assist Water Works personnel by furnishing labor or labor and material to install various size water taps from ¾ inch to 2 inch, inclusive, upon receipt of quotations covering the number and size taps deemed necessary by the Director of Public Service, in order to meet the demand caused by new construction, without advertising for competitive bids, for the period October 27, 1964 through April 1, 1965.

Sec. 2. That the City Auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to honor properly signed vouchers signed by the Director of Public Service and the Superintendent of the Division of Water, appropriating the necessary funds from Water Works Fund No. 390, Major Object Code 460 for labor or labor and material necessary for the installation of new water taps from ¾ inch to 2 inch, inclusive.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is made a part hereof, this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Police, Department of Public Safety, in that it is immediately necessary for the Board of Purchase to award the contract for the purchase of police style plastic riot helmets to the lowest and best bidder, to be used in the Division of Police, for the protection of the police officers and for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore, Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

That the Director of Public Service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract for fire and extended coverage insurance for The Terminal building and Tower and pier structures, the AMF building and the service building at the Columbus Municipal Airport for a three year period, commencing November 1, 1964 and with a \$100.00 deductible provision and on such other terms and conditions consistent therewith.

Sec. 2. That for the purpose of paying the cost thereof, the sum of \$10,133.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated from Airport Fund 0378, Code 440, other operating charges, to pay the cost thereof.
