

ORD. No. 89-71—To authorize and direct the Municipal Civil Service Commission to enter into an agreement with the Board of Education of the Columbus Public School District for services rendered by the Commission to the Board and to declare an emergency.

Whereas, the Civil Service Commission renders service to the Board of Education in personnel testing and other matters, and

Whereas, it is desirable for the Commission and the Board to have a written agreement for payment of these services, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the daily operation of the Municipal Civil Service Commission in that it is immediately necessary to enter into this agreement for the preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus, Ohio:

Section 1. That the Municipal Civil Service Commission be and hereby is authorized and directed to enter into a contract with the Board of Education of the Columbus Public School District for payment to the said Commission for services rendered by said Commission to said Board.

Sec. 2. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

ORD. No. 90-71—To authorize and direct the Board of Purchase to purchase office furniture for the Model Cities Coordinating Unit, without advertising for bids; to appropriate \$5,052.90, and to declare an emergency. (\$5,052.90)

Whereas, the Model Cities Coordinating Unit has provided facilities for various meetings of the Development Corporation and other project operators involved in the Model Cities program; and,

Whereas, there has been a recent increase in the number of personnel authorized to be employed in the Model Cities Coordinating Unit; and

Whereas, the confusion resulting from the various meetings and the additional personnel attempting to work with inadequate office furniture and equipment has restricted the operations of the Model Cities Coordinating Unit; and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Model Cities Coordinating Unit, in that it is necessary to purchase office furniture, without advertising for bids, to expedite the essential public services of this department, thus preserving the public peace, health, safety and welfare; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That it is the finding of this Council that an unforeseeable and true emergency exists in that essential public services rendered by the Model Cities Coordinating Unit will cease if sufficient office furniture is not purchased immediately and there is not sufficient time to advertise for bids.

Sec. 2. That the Board of Purchase is hereby authorized and directed to purchase on the open market without advertising for bids: 1 Heater-Fan; 4 Desk Sets; 4 Ash Stands; 24 Ash Trays; 4 Folding Tables; 10 Wastebaskets; 2 Machine Stands; 10 Bookcases; 10 Cabinets; 1 Desk; 2 Credenzas; 1 Lounge Sofa; 2 Corner Tables; 47 Chairs.

Sec. 3. That the sum of \$5,052.90, or so much thereof as is necessary, be and it is hereby appropriated from Model Cities Coordinating Unit, Fund 0235, Code 600, to pay the cost thereof.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

ORD. No. 127-71—To vacate the alley west of Davis Avenue, from a point four feet north of the north line of the first alley north of State Street to the south line of Capital Street.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owner of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley west of Davis Avenue, from a point four feet north of the north line of the first alley north of State Street to the south line of Capital Street, was duly presented to this Council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation, as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley west of Davis Avenue (alley between Davis Avenue and Souder Avenue), extending from a point four feet north of the north line of the first alley north of State Street to the south line of Capital Street, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the City of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the City, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley hereby vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORD. No. 128-71—To accept the plat of Chatham Village Office Park.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the plat of Chatham Village Office Park, situated in the State of Ohio, County of Franklin, City of Columbus, being in Section 3, Township 1, Range 18, United States Military Lands, being all of that tract of land (7.679 acres of land, more or less, by survey Hockaden, Lipes, Rousculp, Inc.) described in a deed to Scripps College, a California corporation not for profit, of record in Deed Book 2999, Page 435, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, lying north of Ackerman Road and east of Kenny Road, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Sec. 2. That Scripps College does hereby dedicate, grant, release, waive and forever quitclaim to the City of Columbus, Ohio, any and all right or rights of direct vehicular access or claims thereof from or to the present highway improvements known as Kenney and Ackerman Roads, and improvements thereto and the lands of Scripps College, between points designated on plat, either for present or future construction, reserving unto the Scripps College full and unrestricted direct access from and to Kenny Road and the land of Scripps College between points as shown on plat. Scripps College does hereby further grant, release and convey to the City of Columbus, Ohio, a Municipal Corporation, its successors and assigns forever, a perpetual and nonexclusive easement over, under and through the 10' sanitary sewer easement, as designated and delineated on the plat, for the purposes of constructing, using, replacing and maintaining a sanitary sewer, tributary connections and appurtenant work in said 10' sanitary sewer easement, including the rights to clean, repair and care for said sewer together with the right of access to said 10' sanitary sewer easement for said purposes.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the plat of Sharon Woods, Section 7, situated in the State of Ohio, County of Franklin, City of Columbus, being parts of Quarter Township 4, Township 2, Range 18, United States Military Lands, containing 48.908 acres of land, more or less, 0.037 acres of said 48.908 acre tract being part of that 117.794 acre tract of land described in a deed to Reese and Company and Complete General Construction Company, of record in Deed Book 2768, Page 316, and 48.793 acres of said 48.908 acre tract being part of that 159.642 acre tract of land described in a deed to Reese and Company and Complete General Construction Company, of record in Deed Book 2768, Page 291, an undivided one-third (1/3) interest in said 117.794 and 159.642 (and other tracts) acre tracts having been conveyed to Summer and Company by deed of record in Deed Book 2782, Page 519, all being of record in the Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, lying north of Dublin-Granville Road and west of Cleveland Avenue, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Sec. 2. That all or parts of the Drives, Boulevard, Avenues, Streets, Courts, Circle and Place shown on the plat and not heretofore dedicated to public use as such, are hereby dedicated to public use, and easements are reserved, where indicated on the plat, for the construction, operation and maintenance of all public and private utilities, above and beneath the surface of the ground and, where necessary, are for the construction, operation and maintenance of service connections to all adjacent lots and lands and for storm water drainage.
