COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Regular Meeting, Mon., Jan. 29, 1934

Council met in regular session with all members present. Mayor Henry W. Worley being absent from the city, President of Council Frank C. Karns was acting mayor. Mr. Wyatt L. Millikin was elected president pro tem. for the meeting.

The treasury investment board accepted the offer of the Hare charity fund committee for Broad street (state highway No. 47) from Alum creek to west line of Westland avenue bonds. Placed on file.

John Herrel & Sons, Inc., submitted communication with reference to furnishing a white vitrolite counter at stand No. 4, north market. Finance.

The Columbus Citizen's recreation council submitted a petition, asking for exclusion from Beatty Park shelter house of Preston Whitehead. Service.

Arthur S. Butterworth, Inc., submitted a proposal covering utility advisory service. Placed on file.

F. B. Paul and several others submitted a petition, asking for installation of a traffic light at intersection of Lincoln and Hamlet streets. Safety.

Frank C. Karns, president of council, submitted a communication serving notice of meeting of committee with state relief commission with reference to certain unemployment problems. Placed on file.

International brotherhood of teamsters, chauffeurs, stablemen and helpers of America submitted a communication with reference to issuing of permits by the director of public safety to taxicab drivers when they are unable to pay for same. Referred to the taxicab board.

Roger N. Addison, chairman of the Hare Orphans' Home committee submitted notice of appointment of Sarah Gatten as matron of the home. Appointment confirmed by council.

The Citizen's Workers organization of Ohio submitted communication, endorsing Robert Benjamin for appointment to Civil service commission. Referred to the mayor.

Ervil Chrysler submitted claim for damage to property. Judiciary.

The Citizen's Workers organization of Ohio submitted communication, protesting removal of Lee Hennick from the department of charity. Safety department.

The Palmer-Donavin Mfg. company submitted a communication, with reference to a traffic survey of the city. Safety.

Miss Lilly Thomas submitted request to council to provide crossing for school children at Dana avenue and the Baltimore & Ohio railroad. Safety.

Joseph E. Cross, manager of the convention department of The Columbus Chamber of Commerce, submitted a communication supporting the work of Rev. Whitehead at Beatty Park shelter house. Service.

Arthur S. Butterworth, Inc., submitted a communication, thanking council for being given an opportunity to present his program for employment in an advisory capacity on utility matters. Placed on file.

Ordinances Referred

By Mr. Dailey, No. 47-34, to amend sections 4, 5 and 8 of Ordinance No. 291-33, passed October 16, 1933, covering the power of the board of examiners. Safety.

No. 48-34, to amend section 851 of the Columbus Code of 1930, etc., annual fees, dances. Safety.

By Mr. Frank, No. 49-34, to regulate meters on taxicabs. Safety.

By Mr. Dailey, declaring intention to acquire property for relocating Front street from Stewart avenue to Greenlawn avenue, etc. Service.

To divert \$27,000 to poor relief from gas tax funds. Service.

Ordinance Reconsidered and Lost

By Mayor Worley, No. 40-34, to provide for the issuance of a note or notes by the city of Columbus for the purpose of providing money for the general fund in anticipation of the collection of current revenue, etc. (Similar legislation passed this date).

ORDINANCES

AN ORDINANCE No. 13-34—To accept the quit-claim deeds of Edwin A. Stelzer and wife dated October 26, 1933; Flora A. Stelzer, unmarried, et al., dated October 27, 1933, and Lucarta Bauman, unmarried, et al., dated October 30, 1933, and The Welch Chemical company, a corporation of the city of Columbus, dated October 27, 1933, to the city of Columbus, respectively, and to dedicate the premises therein conveyed to public use for street purposes. Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the quit-claim deed of Edwin A. Stelzer, and wife to the city of Columbus, Ohio, dated October 26, 1933; the quit-claim deed of Flora A. Stelzer, unmarried, et al. to the city of Columbus, Ohio, dated October 27, 1933, and the quit-claim deed of Lucarta Bauman, unmarried, et al. to the city of Columbus, Ohio, dated October 30, 1933, and the quit-claim deed of The Welch Chemical company, a corporation of the city of Columbus, to the city of Columbus, dated October 27, 1933 for the dedication of Fifth avenue, 60 feet wide, from Stelzer road eastwardly to James road, as the same is more particularly described in said deeds, respectively, be and the same are hereby accepted and the premises conveyed therein are hereby dedicated to public use for street purposes.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 16-34—Accept the deed of Anna E. Stewart and husband, dated December 28, 1933, and to dedicate the premises therein conveyed to public use for street and park purposes.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the warranty deed of Anna E. Stewart and husband, dated December 28, 1933, for reserve "A", as designated on the plat of subdivision of Rosemary North, of record in plat book 10, page 896, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, and more particularly described in said deed;

Be and the same is hereby accepted and the premises conveyed therein are hereby dedicated to public use for street and park purposes.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 27-34—To amend section 15 of ordinance No. 191-32, passed March 14, 1932, as amended by ordinance No. 531-32, passed December 5, 1932, and section 16 of said ordinance No. 191-32, and to repeal said original section 15, so amended, and original section 16.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That section 15 of ordinance No. 191-32, passed March 14, 1932, as amended by ordinance No. 531-32, passed December 5, 1932, and section 16 of said ordinance No. 191-32 be and the same are hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 15. Rates of fare—taxicabs. All fares, charges or fees for the use of a taxicab shall be determined by (a) the taximeter rate, or (b) the hourly rate, or (c) the special trip rate, and by no other method.

(a) The taximeter rate shall be computed by a taximeter and said rate shall not be more than the maximum rate or less than the minimum rate in the following schedule:

Maximum rate: For the first ¼
