

AN ORDINANCE No. 1380-55—To accept the plat of Woodland Terrace subdivision.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the plat of Woodland Terrace subdivision, situated in the state of Ohio, county of Franklin and city of Columbus, being lots Nos. 2 and 3 of Theodore Leonard's heirs' lands and their subdivision thereof, containing 39.878 acres, as described in deed to the Brocton Development company, recorded in deed book 1888, page 514, of the Franklin county recorder's office, and lying east of Woodland avenue and north of Holt avenue, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Sec. 2. That all or part of the streets and roads shown thereon and not heretofore dedicated are hereby dedicated to public use as such, and easements shown on the plat are for the construction, operation and maintenance, of public utilities and, where necessary, are for the construction, operation and maintenance of service connections to adjacent lots and easements are 10 feet centered on property lines, or property lines produced, unless otherwise shown.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 1381-55—To vacate the alley north of Third avenue, from the west line of Fairview avenue to the east line of the alley west of Fairview avenue, and from the west line of the alley west of Fairview avenue to the east line of North Starr avenue; and the alley west of Fairview avenue, from the north lot lines Nos. 35 and 36 of C. H. and C. C. Walcutt's subdivision extended to the south line of the second alley north of Third avenue.

Whereas, petition signed by the owner of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley north of Third avenue, from the west line of Fairview avenue to the east line of the alley west of Fairview avenue, and from the west line of the alley west of Fairview avenue to the east line of North Starr avenue; and the alley west of Fairview avenue, from the north lot lines of lots Nos. 35 and 36 of C. H. and C. C. Walcutt's subdivision extended to the south line of the second alley north of Third avenue, was presented to this council praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alleys, between the limits specified, and

Whereas, subject to the acceptance of the provisions of section 2 of this ordinance, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for said vacations as prayed for in said petition, that they will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley north of Third avenue, from the west line of Fairview avenue to the east line of the alley west of Fairview avenue, and from the west line of the alley west of Fairview avenue to the east line of North Starr avenue; and the alley west of Fairview avenue, from the north lot lines Nos. 35 and 36 of C. H. and C. C. Walcutt's subdivision extended to the south line of the second alley north of Third avenue, be and the same are hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the Grandview Heights board of education shall cause to be deposited in the treasury of the city of Columbus, Ohio, to the credit of the water works No. 90-602 fund, the sum of \$1,476, to pay a portion of the cost of installing a 6-inch water line in the east side of Fairview avenue, extending from Ida avenue to Fifth avenue.

Sec. 3. That the city of Columbus shall cause the installation of a water

tap at the intersection of Fairview avenue and Ida avenue, for use by the Grandview Heights public schools.

Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law and upon the acceptance of the terms and conditions hereof, by the Grandview Heights board of education, within thirty days after the passage hereof.

AN ORDINANCE No. 1383-55—To vacate the alley north of Mound street, from the east line of lot No. 3 to the east line of lot No. 5, Linen Place addition extended.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owner of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley north of Mound street, from the east line of lots No. 3 to the east line of lot No. 5, Linen Place addition extended, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the limits specified, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley north of Mound street, from the east line of lot No. 3 to the east line of lot No. 5, Linen Place addition extended, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley hereby vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 1384-55—To vacate the alley west of 18th street, from the north line of the first alley north of Gates street to the south line of the second alley north of Gates street.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley west of 18th street, from the north line of the first alley north of Gates street to the south line of the second alley north of Gates street, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the limits specified, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley west of 18th street, from the north line of the first alley north of Gates street to the south line of the second alley north of Gates street, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley hereby vacated, and shall have the right to enter

thereon at any time for the purpose of replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

AN ORDINANCE No. 1385-55—To vacate the alley west of Sunrise avenue, from the north line of the second alley north of Third avenue to the south line of Thornwood place.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley west of Sunrise avenue, from the second alley north of Third avenue to Thornwood place, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the limits specified, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley west of Sunrise avenue, from the north line of the second alley north of Third avenue to the south line of Thornwood place, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley hereby vacated, and does further reserve unto itself perpetual easement for the full width of the alley for the purpose of installing or constructing any new utility facilities, either publicly or privately owned, which may become necessary, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of constructing, installing, replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 1386-55—To authorize payment to the Claggett Electric Company for electrical repairs to the Central Market.

Whereas, Council by Ordinance No. 1129-55, passed September 12, 1955, created the Central Market Trust Fund for the purpose of providing certain repairs to the electrical system and other repairs and improvements; and

Whereas, the Claggett Electric Company performed work on the electrical system to said building; and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Service, Division of Markets, in that it is necessary to make payment to the Claggett Electric Company for labor and material for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. To authorize the Director of Public Service to make payment to the Claggett Electric Company for repairs to the Central Market which include the following:
