Whereas, all money available to the city of Columbus for poor relief under amended senate Bill No. 3, passed by the 89th general assembly of Ohio, March 31, 1932, has been expended for poor relief, and

Whereas, all money available for poor relief from the general fund of the city of Columbus has been expended, and

Whereas, it is necessary to provide additional funds for poor relief to meet the city's portion of total expenditure for the months of May and June, 1933; now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Columbus:

That the council of the city of Columbus hereby petitions the state relief commission and the Ohio State tax commission for permission to issue bonds in accordance with the provisions of section 7 of said amended senate bill No. 63, to provide additional funds for necessary poor relief for May and June, 1933, in the amount of \$125,000, and that the president of the city council appoint a committee of council and such other officials as may be deemed necessary to present this petition and application to the state relief commission and the state tax commission and take such further steps as may be necessary to authorize the issuance of said bonds.

Notice is hereby given of the following competitive examinations to be held at Council Chamber, City Hall, on Wednesday, May 24, 1933, at 9:00 a. m.

Paver, division of engineering, department of public service. Salary of brick paver, .67½ to .70; stone paver, .72½ to .75. No fee.

Duties: To lay stone or brick, so as to conform to grade and contour of surrounding surface; make sand bed, or cushion and perform such other appropriate duties as assigned.

Qualifications: Should have a good eye for grade in order to make patch work meet up with surrounding pavements. Should have at least one year's experience as paver or assistant paver and to be physically and mentally qualified for the position. Age: 21 to 60 years.

Grade "A" draftsman: Municipal service. Salary, \$140.00 to \$147.50 per month. No fee.

Duties: To see that official maps are corrected to date; preparation of descriptions of various plats, etc., in connection with the annexation or acquiring of property for the municipal purposes and preparation of maps; assisting engineers in preparation of plans.

Duties: Under supervision to be responsible for estimating quantities from plans and field notes; to take charge of certain features that enter into the design and construction of sewers and sewage disposal works, and other municipal projects; preparing plans assisting in the preparation of specifications and in the conducting of investigations and preparations of reports in connection with all features of designing in the division of engineering.

Qualifications: Must be a graduate of an engineering school of recognized standing and at least one year's experience as an assistant engineer. Should have special training in assisting in the preparation of plans and contract drawings for sewers and sewage disposal works or other similar municipal engineering structures.
