ORD. No. 1393-74—To authorize and direct the Board of Health to contract with Children's Hospital of Columbus for personnel services for the lead poisoning prevention program; to authorize the expenditure of \$22,500, and to declare an emergency. (\$22,500)

Whereas, it is necessary that funds be made available to Children's Hospital of Columbus, for the provision of personnel services for a full-time laboratory assistant, a part-time medical director, and a part-time social worker for the federally funded lead poisoning prevention program that will benefit the citizens of Columbus, and

Whereas, it is necessary that the lead poisoning prevention program be continued and expanded to protect the health of those children living in high risk areas of Columbus, and

Whereas, it is necessary to hire the above stated personnel to accomplish the goals as stated in the Health Department's federal grant award for lead poisoning, and

Whereas, this Council in the exercise of its sound discretion, deems such an emergency expenditure to be for a public purpose and in the public interest, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Health in that it is immediately necessary to enter into said contract and for the preservation of public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Board of Health be, and it is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Children's Hospital of Columbus for and on behalf of the City of Columbus in the sum of \$22,500 to provide contractual services for the lead poisoning prevention program.

Section 2. That for the purpose of paying the cost thereof the sum of \$22,500 is hereby authorized for expenditure from the Health Special Revenue Fund, Fund No. 0350, Department 500, Major Code 300.

Section 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor, or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.
