**AN ORDINANCE NO. 13-41**—To vacate certain streets and alleys as hereinafter set forth and described.

Whereas, on the 3rd day of January, 1941, a petition by the owners of all the lots and lands bordering upon certain streets and alleys, or portions of streets and alleys, as set forth and designated therein and as hereinafter set forth and described, was presented to council praying that said streets and alleys, or portions thereof, be vacated; and,

Whereas, upon hearing, council is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that such vacation will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following streets and alleys, or portions of streets and alleys, hereinafter set forth and described, be and the same are hereby vacated, to-wit:

**First alley south of West Rich street** from Furnace street west to the west terminus of said alley.

**First alley south of West Rich street**, from Furnace street east to Lucas street.

**First alley south of West Rich street** from Lucas street east to the first alley east of Lucas street.

**West Cherry street** from McDowell street to Lucas street.

**First alley south of Cherry street** from McDowell street east to the east terminus of said alley.

**First alley south of Cherry street** from Furnace street west to the west terminus of said alley.

**First alley south of Cherry street** from Furnace street to Lucas street.

**Sullivant avenue** from Lucas street east to the first alley east of Lucas street.

**Sullivant avenue** from McDowell street east to Lucas street.

**Furnace street** from West Rich street south to Sullivant avenue.

**Lucas street** from West Rich street south to Sullivant avenue.

**Souder avenue** from the south line of Distel avenue, extended, south 537 feet, more or less, to the north line of drive A as shown on plat A-1. Plans for Mt. Calvary project Ohio 1-4 dated 7-12-40.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus hereby reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers and water lines, or any other public utilities, if any, now existing in said streets and alleys, or portions of streets and alleys, so vacated, and to enter thereon for the purpose of operating, repairing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**AN ORDINANCE NO. 14-41**—To vacate certain streets and alleys as hereinafter set forth and described.

Whereas, on the 3rd day of January, 1941, a petition by the owners of all the lots and lands bordering upon certain streets and alleys, or portions of streets and alleys, as set forth and designated therein and as hereinafter set forth and described, was presented to council praying that said streets and alleys, or portions thereof, be vacated; and,

Whereas, upon hearing, council is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that such vacation will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following streets and alleys, or portions of streets and alleys, hereinafter set forth and described, be and the same are hereby vacated, to-wit:

**First alley east of Eighteenth street** from Woodrow avenue to the south line of the second alley north of Woodrow avenue.

**First alley north of Woodrow avenue** from Nineteenth street to the first alley east of Eighteenth street. **Nineteenth street** from the south terminus thereof to the south line of the second alley north of Woodrow avenue extended across Nineteenth street.

**Nineteenth street** from the north line of the second alley north of Woodrow avenue extended across Nineteenth Street to a point 26.5 feet south of the south line of the first alley south of Markison avenue extended.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus hereby reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers and water lines, or any other public utilities, if any, now existing in said streets and alleys, or portions of streets and alleys, so vacated, and to enter thereon for the purpose of operating, repairing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**AN ORDINANCE NO. 15-41**—Authorizing and directing the board of purchase to advertise and open bids for furnishing chemicals for the division of water, department of public service.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of water of the department of public service, in that said division will be without chemicals for the operation thereof until such a time as contracts for said supplies can be entered into for the year 1941; and in that it is necessary to secure said supplies for the usual daily operation of said division, and for the preservation of the public health, peace, and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to advertise and open bids for furnishing chemicals to the division of water, department of public service, required during the year 1941, according to specifications therefor.

Approximate number of tons required: 400 tons coke.

Sec. 2. That for the reason stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

**AN ORDINANCE NO. 16-41**—To authorize and permit the Ohio Bell Telephone company to construct manhole and bury cable on city land at Port Columbus.

Whereas, the Ohio Bell Telephone company in order to give proper service at Port Columbus proposes to construct an underground telephone cable from East Broad street to the south line of lands owned by the city of Columbus comprising Port Columbus; and

Whereas, in order to give the proper service to buildings located on, to be located on the land comprising Port Columbus it is necessary to extend said line and to construct a manhole and bury a telephone cable on said land; and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of airport, in that it is necessary to extend said line and to construct a manhole and bury telephone cable at Port Columbus for the immediate preservation of public property, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. The director of public service be and he is hereby authorized to permit the Ohio Bell Telephone company to construct a manhole on the lands comprising Port Columbus at a point immediately north of the south property line of Port Columbus and on a line of Bagshaw road coming from the south extended northwardly, and to bury a telephone cable on the lands comprising Port Columbus on a line 5 ft. north of the south property line and extending from said manhole east to the administration building, on terms and conditions as follows:

(a) Said manhole to be built and said cable to be laid underground at the sole expense of the Ohio Bell Telephone company, in accordance with plans and at locations approved by the director of public service.

(b) All excavations and trenches to be promptly filled after construction and the surface of the ground to be restored to its present condition and so maintained to the satisfaction and approval of the director of public service.

(c) Said the Ohio Bell Telephone company, its successors and assigns, shall at all times hereafter defend, keep harmless and indemnify said city of Columbus from any and all damage or lawful claims and demands for injury to persons or property, and all cost and expense to which said city may be subjected or may be liable for by any proceeding at law or equity growing out of the construction, maintenance or operation of said manhole and cable so to be located on said property.

(d) The acceptance and use by said the Ohio Bell Telephone company of the privileges granted herein shall be construed as an acceptance of the terms and conditions herein set forth.

2. That for the reason stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

**AN ORDINANCE NO. 17-41**—To authorize and direct the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into contract for the purchase of yard goods and findings for the manufacture of certain ready-made garments, in connection with the maintenance and operation of sewing rooms in the city of Columbus, as provided for in ordinance No. 469-37, passed November 1, 1937, and appropriate the money therefor.
