ORD. No. 154-69—To authorize and direct the Director of Public Service to enter an agreement with J. E. Greiner for professional services at Secondary Airport, to appropriate \$22,000, and to declare an emergency. (\$22,000.00)

Whereas, the engineers have hitherto completed certain professional services for the City of Columbus; and

Whereas, the engineers are presently engaged in the completion of certain professional services in connection with the First Phase development of the Columbus Secondary Airport, and

Whereas, the city is now desirous of having certain other architectural and engineering services completed in connection with the supervision of construction of the Maintenance Hangar and three 10 unit Tee Hangars including preparation of as-constructed plans and all other administrative professional services which may be required therewith, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operations of the Division of Airport, Department of Public Service, in that it is immediately necessary to enter into this engineering service agreement without delay for the preservation of the public peace, property and safety; now, therefore

Section 1. That the Director of Public Service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an engineering service agreement between the City of Columbus, Ohio and J. E. Greiner Company, Consulting Engineers, to proceed with and perform such engineering services as are relative to the supervision of the construction of Maintenance Hangar and Tee Hangars at Port Columbus Secondary Airport together with all other professional administrative services which may be required therewith.

Sec. 2. That for the purpose of paying the cost thereof the sum of Twenty-two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000.00) or so much thereof as may be needed, be and the same is hereby appropriated from Airport Bond Fund No. 6070, Code 460, Capital Outlay.
