AN ORDINANCE NO. 13-37—To authorize and direct the board of purchase to enter into contract for the purchase of one traffic signal maintenance ladder truck automobile, and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, under date of December 17, 1936, bids were received for the purchase of one traffic signal maintenance ladder truck automobile, as authorized by ordinance No. 442-36, passed November 2, 1936, and

Whereas, award was made for the purchase of the aforesaid traffic signal maintenance ladder truck automobile, and

Whereas, the auditor's certificate for the certification of money for the purchase of the aforesaid traffic signal maintenance ladder truck automobile was omitted from the aforesaid ordinance No. 442-36 when passed, and

AN ORDINANCE NO. 14-37—To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into contract or contracts for the purchase of poles and lamps for the division of electricity.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 15-37—To authorize the board of purchase to award contracts for the purchase of materials and supplies for use in the division of engineering and construction during the year 1937, and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, council by ordinance No. 462-36, passed November 23, 1936, authorized the board of purchase to advertise and to open bids for materials and supplies for use in the division of engineering and construction, and

Whereas, said bids were opened and tabulated, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in that said materials and supplies are immediately needed to carry on the work of street maintenance and repair in order to protect the public health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to award contracts for the following materials and supplies for use in the division of engineering and construction on street maintenance and repair work:

Approximately 900 tons mineral dust,
Approximately 7,000 tons asphalt sand,

Approximately 2,000 tons limestone asphalt sand,

Approximately 900 tons asphalt cement,

Approximately 80,000 gallons asphalt road oil,

Approximately 500 tons asphalt filler,

Approximately 300,000 gallons bituminous material A. C. B.,

Approximately 20,000 gallons coal oil,

Approximately 1,200 barrels Portland cement,

Approximately 1,200 barrels High Early strength cement,

Approximately 3,000 tons river or bank sand,

Approximately 6,000 tons crushed gravel,

Approximately 12,000 tons crushed limestone and dust,

Approximately 370,000 paving brick,

Approximately 60 tons calcium chloride,

Approximately 2,000 lineal feet vitrified clay sewer pipe and fittings,

Approximately 55,000 lineal feet 4" drain tile,

Approximately 50 12" hand hold traps,

Miscellaneous castings for manholes and catch basins.

Sec. 2. That from the moneys now in the fund known as the street repair-maintenance and repair fund and from all moneys estimated to come into said fund from any and all sources during the twelve months ending December 31, 1937, there be and it is hereby appropriated the sum of \$120,000 to department No. 65 maintenance and repair fund to pay the cost thereof.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 16-37—To vacate the alley north of Markison avenue from Nineteenth street east to the corporation line.

Whereas, a petition, by the owner of all lots abutting on the alley north of

Markison avenue from Nineteenth street east to the corporation line, was duly presented to council praying that said alley, between the points named, be vacated, and

Whereas, council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for and that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley north of Markison avenue from Nineteenth street east to the corporation line be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and other public utilities owned by said city and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any and all other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley to be vacated and shall have the right to enter thereon for the purpose of operating, repairing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 17-37—To vacate a portion therein described off the east end of the alley north of Rich street between Ludlow street and Riverside drive.

Whereas, a petition, signed by the owners and lessees of all the lots and lands abutting upon a certain portion hereinafter described of the alley north of Rich street between Ludlow street and Riverside drive, was duly presented to the city council on January 11, 1937, praying and consenting that the aforesaid certain portion of said alley therein and hereinafter described be vacated, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following described portion of the alley north of Rich street between Ludlow street and Riverside drive be and the same is hereby vacated:

Beginning at the intersection of the south line of the alley north of Rich street with the east line of the alley west of Ludlow street (formerly Scioto street) as the same are of record on the plat of Jewett Square subdivision in plat book 5, page 452, Franklin county recorder's office, said point of beginning being also the northeast corner of a certain portion of lot No. 3 of said subdivision dedicated to public use for alley purposes by the council of the city of Columbus by ordinance No. 39426, passed October 15, 1928; thence southwardly with the said east line of the alley west of Ludlow street (formerly Scioto street) produced a distance of 19.63 feet, more or less, to the south line of said portion of lot No. 3 so dedicated as alley; thence eastwardly with said south line of alley a distance of 19.57 feet, more or less, to the eastern terminus of said alley; thence northwestwardly with the boundary line of said alley a distance of 27.72 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law upon the payment by the petitioners herein of the cost of publication of this ordinance.
