Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

**AN ORDINANCE No. 171-43**—To accept the deed of the Columbus Metropolitan Housing Authority, dated February 24, 1943, to dedicate the premises therein conveyed to public use for street and highway purposes, and to name said streets.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the deed of the Columbus Metropolitan Housing Authority, dated February 24, 1943, conveying to the city of Columbus: First Tract, consisting of six parcels, located within the boundary limits of Sullivant Gardens Project, Ohio 1-4 of the Columbus Metropolitan Housing Authority; Second Tract, consisting of two parcels, located within the boundary limits of Riverside Homes Project, Ohio 1-3 of the Columbus Metropolitan Housing Authority; and Third Tract, consisting of two parcels, located within the boundary limits of Lincoln Park Homes Project, Ohio 1-2 of the Columbus Metropolitan Housing Authority, which premises are fully described in said deed, be and the same is hereby accepted and the said premises so conveyed are hereby dedicated to public use for street and highway purposes.
