

No. 143-44, providing for the issue of \$140,000 in bonds to pay the cost and expense of extending and improving the municipal waterworks system, said bond fund being designated as waterworks enlargement fund No. 9; and,

Whereas, this council passed, as an emergency measure, an ordinance No. 149-44 authorizing the director of public service to advertise for bids for a new 20-inch water main and a new steel storage tank of one million gallons capacity, and,

Whereas, the director of public service in accordance with said authorization received said bids on May 17th, 1944; and,

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of water of the city of Columbus in that the entering into contracts for said extensions is immediately necessary to provide for the health and safety of the inhabitants of a portion of the north side booster district; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into the necessary contracts at the lowest and best bids received May 17, 1944, for the new Karl Road-Cooke Road 20-inch water main, the furnishing, delivering and erecting of a new steel storage tank, and, the painting of said steel storage tank.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$105,000 or as much thereof as may be needed be and it is hereby appropriated from waterworks enlargement fund No. 9 to pay the cost and expense of said extensions and improvements, said appropriation to be allocated as follows: For Karl Road-Cook Road

Water Main	\$83,000
For steel storage tank.....	17,000
For painting of steel storage tank	5,000.00

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 180-44 To name the 100 foot improved street and highway in the city of Columbus west of the Olentangy river and extending from the south corporation line to the north corporation line, and to repeal section 2 of ordinance No. 411-35, passed August 5, 1935.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the 100 foot improved street and highway in the city of Columbus immediately west of and paralleling the Olentangy river, being the street and highway connecting the Olentangy River Road in Franklin county beginning at said road on the south corporation line of the city of Columbus, also being the south right of way line of the Chesapeake & Ohio railway company, and extending northwardly to the north corporation line of the city of Columbus, said line being 200 feet north of the north line of King avenue, and connecting with said Olentangy River Road in Franklin county at said point, be and the same is hereby named OLENTANGY RIVER ROAD.

Sec. 2. That section 2 of ordinance No. 411-35, passed August 5, 1935, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 181-44 To dedicate the property therein described for street and highway purposes.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following described property, owned by the city of Columbus, be and the same is hereby dedicated to public use for street and highway purposes, to-wit:

Being a strip of land 100 feet in width extending from Third avenue to Fifth avenue, the west line of said 100 foot strip being described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the north line of Third avenue at a distance of 829.34 feet measured eastwardly from the intersection of the said north line of Third avenue with the east right of way line of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway company (formerly the Hocking Valley Railway company); thence northwardly on a line curved to the west with a radius of 840 feet and a central angle of 60° 19¼' a distance of 884.34 feet, arc measurement, (chord length 844.06 feet), to a point, the tangent to the curve at the point of beginning including an angle of 87° 57¼' with the said north line of Third avenue to the west; thence northwardly on a line tangent to the preceding curve and curved to the east with a radius of 940 feet and a central angle of 43° 11', a distance of 708.45 feet, arc measurement, (chord length 691.80 feet) to a point in the south line of Fifth avenue, said point being at a distance of 261.20 feet measured eastwardly from the intersection of the said south line of Fifth avenue with the said east right of way line of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway company, the tangent to the curve at its intersection with the said south line of Fifth avenue including an angle of 70° 20' with the same to the east.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 182-44 To authorize the director of public service to rent from month to month the property known as 2542 McKinley avenue owned by the city of Columbus and to repeal ordinance No. 175-44, passed May 15, 1944.

Whereas, the city of Columbus owns a two-room cottage located at 2542 McKinley avenue and a shed lean-to without flooring, which has in the past been used as a residence; and

Whereas, said premises was leased to R. T. Rush for one year beginning June 1, 1943, ending May 31, 1944, at an annual rental of \$60, payable at the rate of \$5 per month, which has been abandoned by said R. T. Rush and is now vacant; and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, in that it is necessary to rent said premises for the immediate preservation of public property; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized to rent the premises known as 2542 McKinley avenue, which is not needed for public use, to any desirable tenant, by the month, at a monthly rental of not less than \$5; that the moneys received from the rental of said property shall be deposited with the city treasurer to the credit of the division of public lands and buildings.

Sec. 2. That the nature of the things to be accomplished by the renting of said premises is such that this council deems it to be to the public interest to exempt the same from competitive bidding.

Sec. 3. That ordinance No. 175-44, passed May 15, 1944, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. That for the reason stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 183-44 To authorize and direct the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into contract for the purchase of gasoline, motor oils, and tires and tubes, for the division of municipal garage, department of public service, for use in the various divisions of the city government, for the six months period ending December 31, 1944.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of municipal garage, department of public service, in that the present contracts for furnishing gasoline, motor oils, and tires and tubes, for use in the various divisions of the city government, will expire as of June 30, 1944, and it is necessary to provide for same for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into contract for the following supplies for the division of municipal garage, department of public service, in accordance with specifications, for use in various divisions of the city government; and in such quantities as hereinafter set forth, for the six months period ending December 31, 1944:

Approx. 3,000 gallons motor oil;
Approx. 112,000 gallons gasoline; and
Approx. 107 tires and 186 tubes.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$22,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated from division of municipal garage, No. 83, stores account, for the purpose of paying for said purchase of gasoline, motor oils, and tires and tubes.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 185-44 To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into contract or contracts for the purchase of bread for the divisions of workhouse and police, of the department of public safety, and meat for the division of municipal zoo of the department of public service, and to appropriate the money therefor.

Whereas, the contracts for the furnishing of bread and meat to the aforesaid divisions of the city government will expire as of June 30, 1944, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of said divisions, in that it is immediately necessary to provide bread as food for the sustenance of the inmates in the city prison and in the workhouse, both of the department of public safety, and meat for the animals confined in the municipal zoo, of the department of public service; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:
