NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARINGS

A public hearing will be held before the service committee of city council, in the city hall council chamber, Monday, June 4, 1945, at 7:30 p. m., in connection with proposed change of zoning of property being the south one-half of lot 5 of Sullivant Place addition, located on the south side of Sullivant avenue between Martha and Ryan avenues, from a business to a first industrial district. (5-26; 6-2)

A public hearing will be held before the service committee of city council, in the city hall council chamber, Monday, June 4, 1945, at 7:30 p. m., in connection with proposed change of zoning of property being the north one-half of lots 15 to 25, both inclusive, of Rankin and Stewart's subdivision, located on south side of South Lane, between Parsons and alley west, from an apartment to a business district. (5-26; 6-2)

A public hearing will be held before the service committee of city council, in the city hall council chamber, Monday, June 4, 1945, at 7:30 p. m., in connection with proposed change of zoning of property being lots 74 to 80, both inclusive, of Benjamin Monett's subdivision, located on the east side of Brehl avenue between Union and the alley south, from a dwelling to a first industrial district. COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Regular Meeting, Monday, May 28, 1945. (No. 25) 7:00 P. M.

Council met in regular session with President Jones in the chair. The roll being called, the following members

were present: Messrs. Ballin, Evans, Fillinger, Hale, Koontz, Oestreicher and President Jones—7.

The division of sewage treatment submitted results of operation of the sewage treatment works for the weeks ending May 11th and 18th, 1945. Placed on file.

Raymond Link, chief accountant, city auditor's office, submitted report showing the amounts paid to employees of the health department for use of privately owned automobiles during 1945. Finance.

John O. Kramer, public defender, submitted report for the month of April, 1945. Placed on file.

Building Trades Council, 209 South High street, submitted communication requesting the city refrain from using city employees and prison labor on the painting of the city hall. Service.

M. V. Hoover, secretary, Council of South Side Organizations, 864 South Third street, submitted communication in connection with the purchase of acreage on Greenlawn avenue for an athletic field. Service.

ORDINANCES

AN ORDINANCE No. 192-45—To prohibit the parking of vehicles on the west side of Cassidy avenue from Fifth avenue to Sixth avenue.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the parking of vehicles on the west side of Cassidy avenue from Fifth avenue to Sixth avenue, be and the same is hereby prohibited.

Sec. 2. That for the violation of this ordinance, the penalty as fixed in the official traffic code shall apply and be in force.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 195-45—To accept the deed of Ace Building company, and dedicate the premises so conveyed to public use.

Whereas, the elimination of an ir-

regularity in the west line of the alley east of Taylor avenue, from the north line of Greenway avenue to a point north thereof, requires the acceptance of a deed, conveying to the city a strip of land abutting said alley, and the dedication of such strip of land to public use; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the deed of Ace Building company, conveying to the city of Columbus, Ohio a strip of land abutting the west side of the alley east of Taylor avenue, from the north line of Greenway avenue to a point north thereof, more particularly described as follows:

Situated in the city of Columbus, county of Franklin, state of Ohio and being parts of lots Nos. 71, 72 and 73 of William B. Hayden's subdivision, as the same is recorded in plat book 4, page 430, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, the location of said parts of lots being more particularly described as follows:

Being all of the parts of the east ends of said lots Nos. 71, 72 and 73 lying east of a straight line located approximately 147.5 feet east of the east line of Taylor avenue, extending from a point on the east edge of the north end of the west curb of the first alley east of Taylor avenue, said point being on the north line of Greenway avenue and 568.4 feet west of the west line of Eldridge avenue as measured along the north line of Greenway avenue, to a point on the east edge of the south end of the west curb of said alley, said point being on the south line of Harvard avenue and 569.47 feet west of the west line of Eldridge avenue as measured along the south line of Harvard avenue;

be and the same is hereby accepted.

Sec. 2. That the property so conveyed be and it is hereby dedicated to public use for alley purposes.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 196-45—To vacate a portion of the alley east of Taylor avenue.

Whereas, the owner of all of the property abutting the alley east of Taylor avenue, from the north line of Greenway avenue to the alley north of Greenway avenue, has petitioned for the vacation of a portion of said alley, and

Whereas, said owner has agreed to deed a strip of land abutting the west side of said alley to the city of Columbus to be dedicated to public use for alley purposes, and

Whereas, such vacation and dedication will be beneficial to the interests of the general public in that it will eliminate a jog in said alley; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the hereinafter described portion of the alley east of Taylor avenue, extending from the

north line of Greenway avenue to the alley north of Greenway avenue, be and it is hereby vacated:

Situated in the city of Columbus, county of Franklin, state of Ohio, and being a part of the first alley east of Taylor avenue and extending north from Greenway avenue, the part of said alley to be vacated being more particularly described as follows:

Being all of that part of the first alley east of Taylor avenue extending from the north line of Greenway avenue to the alley north of Greenway avenue, lying east of a line parallel to and 15 feet distant from a line extending from a point on the east edge of the north end of the west curb of said alley east of Taylor avenue, said point being on the north line of Greenway avenue and 558.45 feet west of the west line of Eldridge avenue, as measured along the said north line of Greenway avenue, to a point on the east edge of the south end of the west curb of said alley east of Taylor avenue, said point being on the south line of Harvard avenue and 569.47 feet west of the west line of Eldridge avenue, as measured along the said south line of Harvard avenue.

That this ordinance shall have effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, and upon the acceptance by the city of Columbus, Ohio, of a deed, conveying to said city a strip of land, of similar dimensions, abutting the west side of said alley east of Taylor avenue.

AN ORDINANCE No. 197-45—To authorize the director of public safety of the city of Columbus, Ohio, to enter into a contract on behalf of said city with the village of Hanford, Ohio, for furnishing said village with fire protection.

Whereas, in the usual daily operation of the department of public safety and for the preservation of public property and safety, it is immediately necessary to enter into a contract for fire protection with the village of Hanford, Ohio, the corporation of which joins the corporation of the city of Columbus; now, therefore, Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public safety of the city of Columbus be and he is hereby authorized and directed to contract on behalf of the city of Columbus, Ohio, with the village of Hanford, Ohio, on the council of said village providing therefor, for furnishing fire protection to said village and inhabitants thereof for a period of three years from the date of said contract, on the following terms and conditions:

That the City of Columbus is to answer fire calls from the village of Hanford, Ohio, and its inhabitants, and to send fire apparatus and firemen thereto, for the purpose of extinguishing fires in said village in like manner as fire calls are answered and fires extinguished in the city of Columbus; the said village of Hanford to pay therefor annually, in advance, the sum of \$200 and, in addition thereto, the sum of \$50 for each piece of apparatus used in answer to a fire call in said village, \$10 for each mile or fraction thereof traveled by each piece of apparatus from the city limits in going to said fire or place from which such call was made, and \$50 per hour for each hour's service at such fire by each piece of said apparatus, such charges to be paid within thirty days from date of bill rendered therefor.

PROVIDED, however, that in no case shall the city of Columbus be liable in

damages to said village of Hanford, or any of its inhabitants, for failure to answer any fire call or for lack of speed in answering any such call or for any inadequacy of equipment, negligent operation of apparatus, failure to extinguish any fire, or for any cause whatsoever growing out of such agreement and such use of the fire equipment and personnel of said city of Columbus.

Said contract shall also provide that either party thereto may cancel and terminate said contract at any time before the expiration thereof by filing a ninety day written notice with the opposite party of its intention so to do, and if such contract is so canceled as much as ninety days before the ex-

piration of the time for which such annual payment has been made, then and in that instance a refund thereof shall be made for the proportionate time remaining after such cancellation.

Sec. 2. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part thereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 198-45—To fix the salary of the superintendent of recreation and to determine the number of officers and employees and fix the salaries and wages thereof in the division of public recreation, as provided for in sections 112-1 and 112-2 of the charter of the city of Columbus, and to repeal ordinance No. 265-43, passed July 12, 1943.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of public recreation, in that it is necessary to fix the salary of the superintendent of recreation and determine the number of officers and employees and fix the salaries and wages thereof in said division, as provided for in sections 112-1 and 112-2 of the charter of the city of Columbus, for the immediate preservation of public property, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus: Section 1. That the number of officers and employees in the division of public recreation and the salary and wages thereof, and the salary of the superintendent of recreation, be and they are hereby fixed as follows:
