

Ordinances Passed

ORD. No. 1925-85—To authorize and direct the Director of Public Utilities and Aviation to Contract to Furnish and Install Boiler in Zimpro Building at Southerly Wastewater Treatment Plant for the Division of Sewerage and Drainage; to authorize the expenditure of \$27,801.00, and to declare an emergency. (\$27,801)

Whereas, bids to Furnish and Install Boiler in Zimpro Building at Southerly Wastewater Treatment Plant were received and opened on July 17, 1985; and,

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Sewerage and Drainage, Department of Public Utilities and Aviation, in that authorization to award and execute a Contract to Furnish and Install Boiler in Zimpro Building at Southerly Wastewater Treatment Plant, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, property, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Utilities and Aviation be and he is hereby authorized and directed to award and execute a Contract to Furnish and Install Boiler in Zimpro Building at Southerly Wastewater Treatment Plant, in the amount of \$27,801.00, for the Division of Sewerage and Drainage, in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor which are on file and which are hereby approved.

Section 2. That for the aforesaid purpose the expenditure of the sum of \$27,801.00 is hereby authorized from Sewer Fund 80-371, Department 60-05, Index 605337, Minor Object 374, to pay the cost thereof.

Section 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, which shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor, or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

ORD. No. 2010-85—To authorize and direct the City Auditor to contract for certain banking services for the Department of City Auditor, Division of Income Tax; to authorize the expenditure of \$15,000.00 to pay the cost thereof.

ORD. No. 2015-85—To increase the prima facie speed limit from 25 miles per hour to 35 miles per hour on Uly Road between Dublin Granville Road and Mardella Road within the City of Columbus as listed herein.

Whereas, Uly Road is a major thoroughfare passing through Columbus and Franklin County; and, in the absence of corporate boundaries the speed limit on Uly Road would be 35 miles per hour; but, because the section within the City of Columbus is less than a mile in length, the speed limit is now 25 miles per hour in conformance with Ohio Revised Code 4511.21; and,

Whereas, Council has the authority, under Ohio Revised Code 4511.21, to determine and declare a reasonable and safe prima facie speed limit; and,

Whereas, it has been determined from engineering and traffic investigations by the Chief Traffic Engineer of the Division of Traffic Engineering and Parking, Department of Public Service, in coordination with Franklin County, that a speed limit of 35 miles per hour for Uly Road is both reasonable and proper; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That it shall be prima facie lawful for the operator of a motor vehicle or trackless trolley to operate the same at a speed not exceeding 35 miles per hour on Uly Road, between Dublin Granville Road and Mardella Road.

Section 2. That the 35 mile per hour speed limit for Uly Road, as outlined herein, shall be in effect upon erection of the signs giving notice of the authorized speed.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
