WHEREAS, it is deemed desirable to the
City of Columbus that the boundaries of Mont-
gomery Township should be extended so as to
be identical with the corporate limits of the
City of Columbus; now, therefore,

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF

Section 1. That pursuant to the provision of
Section 503.07 of the Ohio Revised Code the
City Attorney be and he is hereby authorized
and directed on behalf of the City of Columbus

requesting such changes in and extensions of
the boundary lines of Montgomery Township
as may be necessary so that said township may
include therein that portion of Orange Town-

Ohio, been annexed to the City of Columbus,

Township co-extensive with the corporate lim-

ORD. No. 2014-95 - To agree to the adjust-
ment of corporate boundaries between the city
of Columbus and the city of Grandview Heights
by consenting to transfer from Columbus to
Grandview Heights 0.892± acres of land lo-
cated generally north of West Third Avenue
between North Star Road and Fairview Ave-
nue as well as a small portion of Fairview
Avenue south of West Third Avenue and being
more fully described herein.

WHEREAS, the city of Grandview Heights
has requested that certain property located
within their high school complex be trans-
ferred from the City of Columbus to Grandview
Heights; and

WHEREAS, portions of the high school com-
plex are located in both jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the Grandview Heights High
School football field is located in Columbus;
and

WHEREAS, the high school would prefer to
have its property located in one jurisdiction;
and

WHEREAS, the proposed boundary change
does not involve the transfer of territory in-
habited by more than five voters; now, therefore,,

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:**

Section 1. That in accordance with the pro-
visions of Section 709.37 of the Ohio Revised
Code, the city of Columbus, Ohio agrees to the
transfer of 0.892± acres of land to the city of
Grandview Heights; said land being described
as follows:

Situated in the State of Ohio County of
Franklin, City of Columbus, and being all the
property conveyed to the Board of Education of
Grandview Heights, lying between North
Star Avenue and Fairview Avenue, north of
Third Avenue and south of Fifth Avenue, and
being more particularly described as follows:

Area 1:
Being lots 9 through 56, inclusive, as delin-
eated on the plat of Walcutt Addition, as re-
corded in Plat Book 5, Page 374, of the Franklin
County Recorder's Office, including the al-
leys adjacent to those Lots, vacated by City of
Columbus Ordinances 152-34, 1381-55, and
118-65;

Also being Lots 203 through 208, inclusive,
the westerly half of Reserve "A", and all of
Reserve "B" as delineated on the plat of Urlin
Grandview Heights Subdivision, as recorded
in Plat Book 4, Page 332 of the Franklin
County Recorder's Office;

Also being the entire right-of-way of North
Star Avenue, easterly of and adjacent to the
entire easterly line of Lot 209 and westerly of

and adjacent to the westerly line of Reserve
"B";

Also being the entire right-of-way of Third
Avenue, from the easterly line of Lot 209 to the
easterly line of Lot 208.

Area 1 contains 0.872 acres more or less.

Area 2:
Being the entire right-of-way of Fairview
Avenue, easterly of and adjacent to the entire
easterly line of Lot 202;

Area 2 contains 0.020 acres more or less.

Section 2. That this ordinance be certified to
the County Commissioners of Franklin County,
Ohio, for further proceedings in accordance
with the law.
