Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That upon the receipt of vouchers properly executed the amount of \$30,000 appropriated from electric light extension fund No. 33 and the amount of \$40,000 appropriated from depreciation fund division of electricity No. 82 by ordinance No. 405-46, passed July 18, 1946, and the amount of \$11,100 appropriated from depreciation fund division of electricity No. 82 by ordinance No. 176-47, passed April 7, 1947, shall be transferred to a new account designated CONTRACT ACCOUNT, SURFACE CONDENSER, ETC., No. 6, IMPROVEMENT PROJECT No. 4, DIVISION OF ELECTRICITY No. 82.

Sec. 2. That the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to certify from said contract account the total amount of \$81,100, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the contract for surface condenser, etc. No. 6, improvement project No. 4, division of electricity, and furthermore, shall pay the cost of said contract from the monies thus deposited in said contract account upon the receipt of properly executed vouchers therefor.

Sec. 3. That upon the completion of the aforesaid contract work and the payment of all costs pertaining thereto to any balance remaining in said contract account shall be returned by the city auditor to the fund or funds from whence it was appropriated, upon the receipt of a properly executed voucher therefor.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 222-47—To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into contract for the purchase of one power take-off spray outfit, 3 cylinders, horizontal, 35 gallons per minute, 600 lbs. to 800 lbs. pressure, 174 revolutions per minute, 20 to 25 horsepower gas engine, 400 gallon capacity, all steel, leak-proof, corrosion resistant tank, all steel electric welded frame, pneumatic tires, for the division of parks and forestry, department of public service, and to appropriate funds to pay the costs thereof.

Whereas, the division of parks and forestry, department of public service is without certain equipment to spray weeds and trees to combat insects, disease, etc. and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of parks and forestry, department of public service, in that it is immediately necessary to purchase equipment from the motor vehicles and motor driven equipment, fund No. 2, to spray trees and weeds in city lots to combat disease, etc., for the preservation of public health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the purchase of one power take-off spray outfit, complete, as noted above, and in accordance with specifications on file in the office of the board of purchase, for the division of parks and forestry, department of public service.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$1250 or so much thereof as may be needed be and the same is hereby appropriated from the monies in the fund known as

the motor vehicles and motor driven equipment, fund No. 2 to pay the costs thereof.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force after its passage and approval by the mayor.

Whereas, Columbus Southern Development company has filed a properly executed petition with this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of the alley west of Broadview avenue, from the south line of Seventh avenue to the north line of the alley south of Seventh avenue, and have agreed to deed to the city of Columbus an eight foot strip of land off of the south side of lot No. 70 of Gypsyland, and extending from the east line of North Star avenue to the east line of said lot No. 70, to be dedicated to public use for alley purposes, and

That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, upon the filing with the clerk of this council by the said owner, its acceptance, in writing, of the terms and conditions of this ordinance, the acceptance of the deed for the herein above described strip of land by the city of Columbus, and the payment of the cost of publication hereof.
