

**AN ORDINANCE, No. 22793.** To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments to pay the cost and expense of improving Harvard avenue, from Taylor avenue to Woodland avenue, in the City of Columbus, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus, State of Ohio:

Sec. 1. That for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the collection of special assessments to pay the cost and expense of improving Harvard avenue from Taylor avenue to Woodland avenue, by grading and paving the roadway with Hooking Valley block, setting five-inch curb and constructing the necessary subdrains and catch basins, in the City of Columbus, Ohio, in pursuance of ordinance No. 22631, determining to proceed with said improvement, passed January 29, 1906, bonds of the City of Columbus shall be issued to the amount of eight thousand dollars.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be issued under authority of an act of the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, entitled, "An act to provide for the organization of cities and incorporated villages, etc.," passed October 22, 1902, and the amendments thereof; they shall bear date not later than the first day of September, 1906, be due and payable on the first day of September, 1916, but subject to call or redemption at the option of the City of Columbus on or after the first day of September, 1907; they shall be of the denomination of \$1000 each and numbered consecutively from one (1) to eight (8), both inclusive.

Sec. 3. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four per cent. per annum, and all interest accruing on said bonds shall mature and be due and payable on the first days of March and September of each year, and for which the proper interest coupons shall be attached and made part of said bonds. Both principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the treasurer of the City of Columbus, Ohio.

Sec. 4. Each bond shall be signed by the mayor and the auditor of the City of Columbus, Ohio, officially in their own handwriting and have affixed thereto the corporate seal of said city. Each coupon shall have printed thereon a fac-simile of the signature of the auditor, and the faith, credit and property of the City of Columbus, Ohio, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of said bonds and interest thereon at maturity.

Sec. 5. The committee on finance of this council is hereby authorized and directed to have said bonds and coupons properly prepared and executed in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, to record them in the office of the city auditor and in the office of the trustees of the sinking fund, and to negotiate and sell the same in the manner prescribed by law.

Sec. 6. The proceeds of the sale of said bonds shall be paid into the city treasury by said committee on finance and set aside in a fund to be designated as the Harvard avenue, Taylor to Woodland fund; all premiums and accrued interest received from the sale of said bonds shall be transferred, on warrant of the city auditor, to the trustees of the sinking fund of said city, to be by them applied in the manner prescribed by law.

Sec. 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**AN ORDINANCE, No. 22795.** To vacate the alley north of Campbell avenue, from the west line of the alley west of Sandusky street to a point in said alley 15 feet east of the west line of lot No. 152 Osborn Place addition.

Whereas, On the 19th day of February, 1906, a petition was duly presented to Council praying that said alley between the points named be vacated, and

Whereas, Notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition has been given as required by law, by publication in the Press-Post, a newspaper of general circulation in the corporation, for six consecutive weeks ending March 28, 1906, and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for; that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and ought to be made; now,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus, State of Ohio:

Sec. 1. That the alley north of Campbell avenue from the west line of the alley west of Sandusky street to a point in said alley 15 feet east of the west line of lot No. 152, Osborn Place addition, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**RESOLVED,** By the Council of the City of Columbus, State of Ohio:

a. That it is necessary to improve Germania street, from Parsons avenue to the second alley east of Heyl avenue, by grading and paving the roadway thereof with asphalt, hard-burned brick or block, or other substantial material, setting five-inch curb and constructing the necessary subdrains and catch basins; in the City of Columbus, Ohio, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles of the proposed improvement prepared by the chief engineer, which are hereby approved.

b. That the grade of said street as improved shall be as shown on the plans, to-wit:

North Curb—Beginning at the intersection of the north curb line of Germania street with the east curb line of Parsons avenue at elevation 84.75 feet, city datum; thence on a 0.35 per cent. ascending grade for a distance of 670 feet to a point, at elevation 87.10 feet; thence on a 0.52 per cent. ascending grade for a distance of 805 feet to a point, at elevation 89.65 feet; thence on a 0.38 per cent. ascending grade for a distance of 375 feet to a point, at elevation 91.10 feet; thence on a 0.35 per cent. ascending grade for a distance of 380 feet to the east lot line of the second alley east of Heyl avenue at elevation 92.45 feet.

South Curb—The elevation of the south curb shall be the same as the north curb.

c. That the whole cost of said improvement, less one-fiftieth thereof and the cost of intersections, shall be assessed in proportion to the special benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement, and in an amount equal to the cost thereof.

d. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in ten annual installments, with interest on deferred payments at a rate not exceeding six per cent. per annum; provided that the owner of any property assessed may at his option, pay such assessment or any number of installments of the same at any time after such assessment has been levied, with interest to the semi-annual interest day of said bonds next following the date of payment.

e. That bonds of the City of Columbus, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments by installments, and in an amount equal thereto.

f. That the remainder of the entire cost of said improvement shall be paid by the issuance of bonds in the manner provided by law.
