### COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Regular Meeting, Monday, July 9, 1945. (No. 31) 7:00 P. M.

Council met in regular session with President Jones in the chair. The roll being called, the following members were present: Messrs. Ballin, Evans, Fillinger, Hale, Koontz, Oestreicher and President Jones—7.

R. P. Barthalow, city auditor, submitted summary of fund transactions for the six-month period ending June 30, 1945, together with statement of receipts for various years. Placed on file.

P. W. Mactzel, chief engineer, submitted report on the repair of certain asphalt streets in which the abutting property owners were contacted to bear a portion of the cost. Service.

Earl F. Davis, superintendent of the municipal zoo, submitted communication relative to parking conditions at the zoo grounds and requesting additional facilities. Service.

Municipal Civil Service Commission submitted copies of sick reports for the divisions of fire and police for the month of May, 1945. Placed on file.

The division of sewage treatment submitted results of operation of the sewage treatment works for the weeks ending June 22nd and 29th, 1945. Placed on file.

The following divisions submitted monthly reports for June, 1945: sewage treatment works, water, parks and forestry, markets, public lands and buildings, airport, zoo, comfort stations, engineering and sewers and drains. Placed on file.

Delmas Jividen, 2495 Sullivant avenue, and twenty-three others, submitted petition objecting to the noise at premises known as the Big Nickel Cafe, 2490 Sullivant avenue. Safety.

C. D. Beck, 64 East Pacemont road, and approximately forty-four others, submitted a petition requesting the removal of "no parking signs" from the north side to the south side of Pacemont road. Safety.

Robert L. Springer, Sr., 2954 E. 13th avenue, submitted claim for damages to his automobile when it struck an open manhole at Spring street and Marconi boulevard. Judiciary.

Lee B. Palmer, P. O. Box 1105, Columbus, Ohio, submitted claim for damages to his automobile when backed into by a city truck at side of residence, 1640 Indianola avenue. Judiciary.

By Mr. Hale, to provide for the annual budget for municipal purposes for the year 1946. Finance.

## ORDINANCES

AN ORDINANCE No. 234-45—To authorize the director of public service to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the installation of fluorescent lighting in the offices of the division of engineering and construction.

Whereas, the present lighting fixtures in the drafting rooms in the division of engineering and construction are inadequate; now, therefore, Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the purchase and installation of fluorescent lighting fixtures in the various offices in the division of engineering and construction, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the office of the said director of public service.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$1,500, or so much thereof as may be needed, be and it is hereby appropriated from the maintenance and repair No. 65-700 fund to pay a portion of the cost thereof.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and

after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 235-45—To accept the deed of the D. L. Auld company, and dedicate the premises so conveyed to public use.

Whereas, council by ordinance No. 216-45, passed July 2, 1945, vacated the alley north of Fifth avenue, from the east line of the alley west of Fifth street to Fifth street, provided the D. L. Auld company deed a strip of land 8 feet in width off the south side of lot No. 140 in lieu thereof; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the deed of the D. L. Auld company, conveying to the city of Columbus, Ohio a strip of land 8 feet in width off the south side of lot No. 140 of New Indianola addition, more particularly described as follows:

Situated in the city of Columbus, county of Franklin, state of Ohio, and being a part of lot No. 140 of New Indianola addition, as the same is recorded in plat book No. 12, page 35, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, and being also a part of the vacated alley between Fourth street and Fifth street, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the southwest corner of said lot No. 140, said point being also the northeast corner of Fourth street and the first alley north of Fifth avenue; thence northwardly with the east line of Fourth street, a distance of 8 feet to a point; thence eastwardly with a line parallel to the south line of said lot No. 140 a distance of 132 feet to a point, said point being 1.1 feet, more or less, east of the west line of the aforementioned vacated alley; thence southwardly with a line parallel to the west line of said vacated alley, a distance of 8 feet to a point in the north line of the said first alley north of Fifth avenue; thence westwardly with said north line of said alley and the south line of said lot No. 140 a distance of 132 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning;

be and the same is hereby accepted.

Sec. 2. That the property so conveyed be and it is hereby dedicated to public use for alley purposes.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
