Sec. 2. That the sum of \$390,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and it is hereby appropriated from the sewerage relief fund No. 101 to pay the cost and expense thereof.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 21-30—To authorize the director of public service to enter into a contract with the board of education of the city school district of Columbus, Ohio, to remove ashes and refuse as herein provided.

Whereas, an emergency exists in that it is necessary to enter into contract with the board of education, said contract to be effective January 18, 1930, for the hauling from school buildings of ashes and refuse; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized to enter into a contract on behalf of the city of Columbus, Ohio, with the board of education of the city school district of Columbus, Ohio, for the removal by the division of street cleaning and refuse collection, of all ashes and refuse accumulated in the different school yards owned by the said board of education in accordance with the schedule therefor now on file in the office of the said board of education, for a period beginning January 18, 1930, and ending January 17, 1931, for which the said board of education agrees to pay the said city of Columbus the sum of \$2600 in eleven monthly installments of \$216.66 each, and one installment of \$216.74.

Sec. 2. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 22-30—Authorizing the board of purchase to advertise for bids and to contract for the purchase of one 10,000-gallon tank car of gasoline for use in the division of garbage disposal.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the garbage disposal plant in that it is immediately necessary to provide gasoline for the proper operation of the process of garbage disposal; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized to advertise for bids and contract for the purchase of one 10,000-gallon car of gasoline for use in the division of garbage disposal.

AN ORDINANCE No. 24-30—Authorizing and providing for the conveyance to the state of Ohio, of certain parcels

of real property owned by the city of Columbus, Ohio, on the west side of Scioto street between Broad and Town streets in said city.

Whereas, the city of Columbus, Ohio, owns certain parcels of land and real property situated on the west side of Scioto street between Broad street and Town street in said city; and, whereas, the state office building commission heretofore appointed and qualified under the provisions of house bill No. 17, passed by the 88th general assembly March 14, 1929, approved by the governor April 6, 1929, and which went into effect July 7, 1929, has heretofore, under the authority of said act, selected as the site for the erection and construction of a state office building certain lots and lands in the city of Columbus, Ohio, extending west from Front street between Broad street and Town street in said city, which site so selected includes within its boundary lines and as a part of said site said parcels of land and real property of the city hereinafter described; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That, in consideration of the many and manifest benefits derived by the city of Columbus, Ohio, and by other property owned by it from the location of said state office building in the city of Columbus and on the site therefor selected by said state office building commission, and pursuant to the authority conferred upon the city of Columbus by said act, there be conveyed and transferred by the city of Columbus to the state of Ohio by fee simple title and without cost to the state of Ohio, the following described parcels of land and real property, and all the title and interest which the city of Columbus may have in and to the same, consisting in the aggregate of approximately ten one-hundredths of an acre, to-wit:

Parcel 1

Situated in the county of Franklin, state of Ohio, city of Columbus, and being a part of Capital street vacated by the council of the city of Columbus by ordinance No. 1836, passed October 26, 1885, and parts of lots 776, 777, 778, 779, 780, 781, 782, 783, 784, 785, 786, 787, 788 and 789 of Wharf lots addition to the city of Columbus as the same are numbered and delineated upon the recorded plat thereof, of record in deed book 9, page 372, Franklin county recorder's office, the aforesaid parts intended herein to be conveyed being more particularly described as follows: beginning at the intersection of the west line of Scioto street with the north line of State street, being also the southeast corner of said Wharf lot No. 789; thence northwardly with the said west line of Scioto street 404.62 feet to an angle in the said west line of Scioto street; thence northwestwardly with the northwesterly line of Scioto street 77.83 feet to a point; thence southwardly on a line curved to the west with a radius of 1262.44 feet to a distance of 478.61 feet (arc measurement) to a point in the said north line of State street, being also in the south line of said Wharf lot No. 789; thence eastwardly with the said north line of State street 20.49 feet to the place of beginning.

Parcel 2

Situated in the county of Franklin, state of Ohio, city of Columbus, and being parts of lots 790, 791, 792 and 793 of Wharf lots addition to the city of Columbus as the same are numbered and delineated upon the recorded plat thereof, of record in deed book 9, page 372, Franklin county recorder's office, described more particularly as follows: beginning at the intersection of the west line of Scioto street with the south line of State street, being also the northeast corner of said Wharf lot No. 790; thence westwardly with the said south line of State street 16.10 feet to a point; thence southwardly on a line curved to the west with a radius of 1262.44 feet a distance of 126.73 feet (arc measurement) to a point in the said west line of Scioto street; thence northwardly along the said west line

of Scioto street 130.55 feet to the place of beginning.

Parcel 3

Situated in the county of Franklin, state of Ohio, city of Columbus, and being parts of lots 798, 799, 800 and 801 of Wharf lots addition to the city of Columbus as the same are numbered and delineated upon the recorded plat thereof, of record in deed book 9, page 372, Franklin county recorder's office, described more particularly as follows: beginning at the intersection of the west line of Scioto street with the north line of Town street, being also the southeast corner of said Wharf lot No. 801; thence northwardly along the said west line of Scioto street 117.41 feet to a point; thence southwardly on a line curved to the west with a radius of 1262.44 feet a distance of 122.93 feet (arc measurement) to a point in the said north line of Town street, being also in the south line of Wharf lot No. 801; thence eastwardly along the said north line of Town street 15.42 feet to the place of beginning.

Sec. 2. That the mayor and director of public service of the city of Columbus, Ohio, be and hereby are authorized and directed to execute and deliver to the state of Ohio a deed in proper form conveying to the state of Ohio the above described real property.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance be in force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 25-30—To make appropriations from the street maintenance and repair funds for the twelve months ending December 31, 1930.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That from the moneys in the fund known as the street maintenance and repair fund and from all moneys estimated to come into said fund during the twelve months ending December 31, 1930, there be and there hereby are appropriated the sums and for the purposes hereinafter stated. Sec. 2. That moneys from the appropriations in the foregoing section 1 shall be paid upon order of the director of public service and that no order shall be drawn or money paid except upon vouchers the form of which shall be approved by the city auditor.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
