ORD. No. 2451-80--To increase the prima facie speed limit from thirty-five miles per hour to fifty miles per hour upon Hilliard-Rome Road, the City portion between Renner Road and 700 feet north of Roberts Road, to coincide with the fifty miles per hour limit on the County portion of the roadway, a total of 1.6 miles in length.

Whereas, Section 4511.21 of the Revised Code of Ohio authorizes local authorities to raise existing speed limits not to exceed fifty miles per hour; and

Whereas, it has been determined by the Chief Traffic Engineer of the Division of Traffic Engineering and Parking, Department of Public Service, from studies and surveys that:

That portion of Hilliard-Rome Road within the City of Columbus between Renner Road and 700 feet north of Roberts Road, should be increased in prima facie limit for the preservation of the public peace, property, health, and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That it shall be prima facie lawful for the operator of a motor vehicle or trackless trolley to operate the same at a speed not exceeding the following:

Fifty miles per hour on Hilliard-Rome Road, between Renner Road and 700 feet north of Roberts Road, all within the City of Columbus, a total of 1.6 miles in length.

Section 2. That the fifty miles per hour speed limit for Hilliard-Rome Road as outlined herein, shall be in effect upon erection of the signs giving notice of the authorized speed.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORD. No. 2494-80--To authorize the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a contract with Neighborhood Development Corporation of Columbus to provide relocation services, and to declare an emergency.

Whereas, the Department of Development, Division of Community Development has been requested by Neighborhood Development Corporation of Columbus to provide relocation services for business and residential occupants located in the Mt. Vernon E.D.A. Supermarket Project Area; and

That the City Auditor is hereby authorized to transfer the unencumbered balance in a project account to the unallocated balance account within the same fund upon receipt of certification by the Director of the Department administering said project, that the project has been completed and the monies are no longer required for said project except that no transfer shall be so made from a project account funded by monies from more than one source.

Section 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its

Whereas, said relocation services to be so provided will be paid for by said Neighborhood Development Corporation of Columbus; and

Whereas, land acquisition activities in the Project Areas are about to begin; and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Development, Division of Community Development in that it is necessary that relocation services for the occupants to be displaced from the Mt. Vernon E.D.A. Supermarket Project Area begin in conjunction with the land acquisition activities all for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Department of Development, acting by and through the Director of the Department of Development, is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Neighborhood Development Corporation of Columbus to provide relocation services for the business and residential occupants to be relocated from the Mt. Vernon E.D.A. Supermarket Project, reimbursement to the Department of Development for said services to be made in accordance with the terms of the contract.

Section 2. That for reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Mayor or ten days after passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.
