AN ORDINANCE, No. 24820, To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Haviland avenue, from Broad street to Main street, in the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Haviland avenue, from Broad street to Main street, by grading and paving the roadway with California asphalt, with Nelsonville block gutters, setting five-inch curb and constructing the necessary sub-drains and catch basins, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, in pursuance of Ordinance No. 24732, passed July 26, 1909, bonds of the city of Columbus, shall be issued to the amount of \$23,000.00.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the mayor and auditor; bear date not later than December 1, 1909, and be due and payable September 1, 1921. They shall be of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each, and numbered from one to twenty-three, both inclusive. They shall bear interest at the rate of four per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of March and September of each year, and for which the proper interest coupons, bearing a fac-simile of the signature of the auditor, shall be attached and made a part of said bonds. Principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the treasurer of the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Sec. 3. The committee on finance of this Council is hereby directed to have said bonds and coupons properly prepared and executed, to sell the same and to deposit the proceeds in the city treasury in a fund to be designated Haviland avenue, Broad to Main Fund, for the purpose of paying the portion of the cost of said improvement not heretofore provided to be paid by the city and for which purpose said money is hereby appropriated.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE, No. 24740. To amend Section 3 of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance to regulate and license persons, firms and corporations, or their officers and agents, for the selling of goods, wares, vegetables or fruits on the streets and alleys of the city of Columbus, Ohio," No. 22030, passed September 30, 1904.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That Section 3 of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance to regulate and license persons, firms and corporations, or their officers and agents, for the selling of goods, wares, vegetables or fruits on the streets and alleys of the city of Columbus, Ohio," No. 22030, passed September 30, 1904, be amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 3. Each license shall be for the full period of one year, shall become operative on the first (1st) day of January and end on the thirty-first (31st) day of December of the year in which it is issued. No license shall be issued to any hawker, peddler, vendor or dealer, unless at the time application is made for a license, he presents a receipt from the Sealer of Weights and Measures, showing that the weights and measures used by him have been properly inspected, tested and sealed, immediately preceding the issuance of such license.

Sec. 2. That said Section 3 of said Ordinance No. 22030, as passed September 30, 1904, be and the same hereby is repealed.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE, No. 24805. Authorizing the Board of Public Service to purchase the property therein described, for the purpose of opening Ninth avenue.

Be it ordained by the Council of the

City of Columbus, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Service be and it is hereby authorized and directed to purchase the following described property for the purpose of opening Ninth avenue, from Section alley to Summit street.

"Being seventy-two and one-half (72.5) feet off of the east end of lot number fourteen (14) of Evans and Cheetham's amended subdivision, to the City of Columbus, Ohio," and owned by Richard Wells.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$1600 is hereby appropriated from the Ninth avenue Opening Fund to pay the cost and expense thereof.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
