

AN ORDINANCE No. 255-56—To vacate the alley north of Mound street, from the west line of the first alley west of Kelton avenue to the west line of the second alley west of Kelton avenue, and the second alley west of Kelton avenue, from the south line of the alley north of Mound street to the north line of Mound street.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley north of Mound street and the second alley west of Kelton avenue, between specified points, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alleys, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacations as prayed for in said petition, that they will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley north of Mound street, from the west line of the first alley west of Kelton avenue to the west line of the second alley west of Kelton avenue, and the second alley west of Kelton avenue, from the south line of the alley north of Mound street to the north line of Mound street, be and the same are hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 256-56—To accept the plat of Oakland Park place.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the plat of Oakland Park place, located in the city of Columbus, Franklin county, Ohio, and comprising the 9.618 acre tract conveyed by Charles L. Resch, sheriff, Franklin county, Ohio, to Oliver Innis by sheriff's deed, dated June 19, 1914, and recorded June 23, 1914, in deed book 508, page 268, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, being also parcel No. 6 of the partition of the estate of Mary Innis, and lying north of Oakland Park avenue and east of Oak Park addition No. 6, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Sec. 2. That all streets, avenues and roads shown thereon and not heretofore dedicated within the limits shown are hereby dedicated to public use as such; buildings lines are established as shown; and easements are for the construction, operation and maintenance of utilities, both overhead and underground.

AN ORDINANCE No. 257-56—To accept the plat of Indian Springs Village, resubdivision of part of block "T".

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the plat of Indian Springs Village, resubdivision of part of Block "T", being a resubdivision of lots Nos. 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 of block "T", Indian Springs Village and Sharon Court (vacated), as said lots and court are shown, numbered and delineated on the recorded plat of Indian Springs Village, Parts of blocks L, M and T, shown of record in plat book 27, page 52, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, the above mentioned Sharon court having been vacated by action of the council of the city of Columbus, Ohio, on January

9, 1956, by ordinance No. 18-56, and being also parts of those tracts of land described as 1st and 4th parcels in the deed of W. C. Harrison, trustee, and Mary Louise A. Harrison, his wife, to Indian Springs Village, inc., as the same is shown of record in deed book 1384, page 544, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, said resubdivision lying south of Springs drive, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Sec. 2. All easements shown on the plat are for the construction, operation and maintenance of public utilities.

AN ORDINANCE No. 259-56—To establish a uniform building or setback line on the east side of Barnett Road, between certain specified points.

Whereas, upon consideration of legislation to establish a certain uniform building or setback line on a portion of Barnett Road, presented to the City Planning Commission at its meeting held on Thursday, February 16, 1956, said Commission unanimously adopted a motion, duly moved and seconded, that the setback line on the east side of Barnett Road from the eastward extension of the center line of the first alley south of East Main Street southward to a point 390 feet south of Fulton Street and 177.7 feet north of Barnett Heights Subdivision, be established at sixty-five (65) feet east of the center line of said Barnett Road; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus, Ohio:

Section 1. That the Zoning Map attached to Ordinance No. 38852, passed February 27, 1928, and as subsequently amended, be and the same is hereby revised by establishing a uniform building or setback line on the east side of Barnett Road, from the eastward extension of the center line of the first alley south of East Main Street to a point 390 feet south of the south line of Fulton Street and 177.7 feet north of the Barnett Heights Subdivision, to be sixty-five (65) feet east of the existing center line of Barnett Road.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 260-56—To authorize an additional appropriation to certificate No. 1432 for the purpose of certifying a contract for One Hundred and Fifty (150) Sam Browne Belts, One Hundred and Fifty (150) Shoulder Holsters to be worn by the police officers in the Division of Police, Department of Public Safety.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of police, department of public safety in that it is immediately necessary to purchase Sam Browne Belts, Holsters and Shoulder Straps to be worn by the police officers, in order to protect the public safety, property, peace and welfare; now, therefore,

Section 1. That the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized to make an additional appropriation to certificate No. 1432 in the amount of \$267.50.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$267.50 be and the same is hereby appropriated from Division No. 36, Code 700, to pay the cost thereof.
