ORDINANCE NO. 26100—To levy special assessment upon the lots and lands benefited by the improvement of Jaeger Street, from Bryden Street to Main Street;

and by the council of the city of Columbus, state of Ohio:

Section 1. That the assessment of the cost and expense of improving Jaeger Street, from Bryden Road to Main Street, by grading, draining, and paving the roadway with asphalt, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, as reported to the council of the city of Columbus, Ohio, by the assessing board heretofore appointed for that purpose, and which report was filed in the office of the city clerk on September 6, 1911, be and the same is confirmed, and that there be levied and assessed upon the lots and land described in said report the several amounts as therein set forth. It is hereby determined and ordered that each of said lots and lands specially benefited by said assessment and in amount equal to the same.

Sec. 2. That the total assessment to be payable at the office of the city treasurer of Columbus, Ohio, within a period of thirty (30) days from the date of the first publication of this ordinance with interest at the rate of five per cent from the first day of January, 1911, or at the option of the owner in ten annual installments of interest at the rate of four per cent annum upon deferred payment at the office of the county treasurer after the same has been certified by the county auditor for collection in the manner provided by law. The said assessment after being so certified may, however, be paid in full or by number of annual installments at any time, with interest on same to semi-annual interest date ensuing. If said installments are not paid when they become due, a penalty will be imposed and collected, as provided by law.

Sec. 3. That the said assessment shall be paid into the sinking fund and shall be applied to the payment of the bonds issued for said purpose and the interest thereon as same shall become due, and to no other purpose whatsoever.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 26082—To vacate the alley between Dana Avenue and Princeton Avenue, from the first alley north of Sullivant Avenue to the south side of lots 70 and 94 in the Dana Avenue addition.

Whereas, the owners of all the lots abutting on the portion of the alley between Dana Avenue and Princeton Avenue, hereinafter designated, have filed with this council their written consent to the vacation of the alley between Dana Avenue and Princeton Avenue, from the first alley north of Sullivant Avenue to the south side of lots 70 and 94 in the Dana Avenue addition, and

Whereas, this council, upon hearing and being satisfied that there is good cause for the vacation, and that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and that the same should be made, by law, therefore,

It is ordained by the council of the city of Columbus, state of Ohio:

Section 1. That the alley between Dana Avenue and Princeton Avenue, from the first alley north of Sullivant Avenue to the north side of lots 70 and 94 in the Dana Avenue addition, and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
