Sec. 2. That the nature of the things to be accomplished by granting the lease hereby authorized is such that this council deems it to be to the public interest to exempt the same from competitive bidding.

AN ORDINANCE No. 272-48—To authorize the purchase of pipe for street signs in the open market without advertising for bids.

Whereas, pursuant to ordinance No. 707-47, passed December 15, 1947, the board of purchase accepted bids for the furnishing of steel or aluminum pipe to be used for posts for the mounting of street name signs, and

Whereas, the only proposal received stipulated that an approximately delivery date would be 180 days from the date of contract, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of engineering and construction, in that the furnishing of street name plates is under contract and some plates delivered, and the contract for the erection thereof has been made and entered into, and it is immediately necessary that posts be furnished the erection contractor in order that the street name plates may be erected in order to protect the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to purchase sufficient pipe to be used for posts for the erection of street name plates, in accordance with the specifications on file in the office of the board of purchase, without advertising for bids.

Sec. 2. That the cost of such pipe shall be paid from the maintenance and repair No. 65 — 602 fund, as appropriated by said ordinance No. 707-47, passed December 15, 1947.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 273-48—To authorize the Board of Purchase to advertise for bids and enter into contract for the purchase of a Mist Sprayer equipped with a gasoline motor of not less than 30 horse-power, for use in the Division of Parks & Forestry Department of Public Service, and to appropriate the necessary funds to pay the costs thereof.

Whereas: an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Parks & Forestry, Department of Public Service, in that the purchase of the aforesaid equipment is immediately necessary in order to carry out the work of the division of Parks & Forestry in spraying city trees for the control of insects and disease and for the preservation of public health, property, peace and safety, now, therefore,

Be it ordained by The Council of The City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Board of Purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into contract for the purchase of 1 - Mist Sprayer complete with gasoline motor of not less than thirty horse-power and in accordance with specifications on file in the office of the Board of Purchase for the Division of Parks & Forestry, Department of Public Service.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$2,700.00 or so much thereof as may be needed be and the same is hereby appropriated from the fund known as the Motor Vehicle and Motor Driven Equipment Fund No. 3 to pay the costs thereof.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto which is made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 274-48—To vacate the alley east of Whittier street, from the south line of lot No. 10 of Neeley Sawhill Estate subdivision to a point 94.68 feet south of the south line of lot No. 5 of said subdivision.

Whereas, a petition, properly executed by the owners of the property abutting the alley east of Whittier street, from the south line of lot No. 10 of Neeley Sawhill Estate subdivision to a point 94.68 feet south of the south line of lot No. 5 of said subdivision, praying and consenting to the vacation of said alley, has been filed with council, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that such vacation will not be detrimental to the interest of the general public; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by The Council of The City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley east of Whittier street, from the south line of lot No. 10 of Neeley Sawhill Estate subdivision to a point 94.68 feet south of the south line of lot No. 5 of said subdivision, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the City of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and other public utilities, owned by said city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any and all other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley to be vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of operating, replacing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 282-48—To authorize and direct the Board of Purchase to advertise for bids and enter into contract or contracts for the purchase of 24,000 gallons of kerosene for the Department of Health.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Health in that it is necessary to obtain 24,000 gallons of kerosene for the use in the thermal aerosol fog generator for the control of flies and other disease-carrying insects, by the beginning of the fly season, for the preservation of the public health, welfare and safety, now, therefore,

Be it ordained by The Council of The City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Board of Purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into contract or contracts for the purchase of 24,000 gallons of kerosene for the Department of Health, with delivery of such amounts and at such times as shall be specified by the Department of Health in its requisition to the Board of Purchase.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$4,800.00 or as much thereof as may be needed be and the same is hereby appropriated from Code B-1, Department No. 50, to pay for the cost of same.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure to take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.
