ORDINANCE NO. 27663—To provide for the issue of bonds to pay the cost and expense of constructing a sewer in Cypress Avenue, from Bellows Avenue to Mound Street.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus, state of Ohio:

Section 1. That for the purpose of raising money to pay the cost and expense of constructing a sewer in Cypress Avenue, from Bellows Avenue to Mound Street, to provide for storm water, it is hereby declared necessary to issue, and there shall be issued bonds of said city to the amount of two thousand (\$2000.00) dollars.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the mayor and auditor, bear date not later than March 1, 1914, and be due and payable March 1, 1924, but subject to call or redemption at the option of the city of Columbus, Ohio, on or after March 1, 1915. They shall be of the denomination of one thousand dollars each, and numbered from one to two, both inclusive. They shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of March and September of each year, and for which the proper interest coupons, bearing a facsimile of the signature of the auditor shall be attached and made a part of said bonds. Principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the treasurer of the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Sec. 3. For the purpose of paying the interest on the bonds herein authorized and providing a sinking fund for their final redemption at maturity, the trustees of the sinking fund of the city of Columbus, Ohio, shall annually certify to the auditor of Franklin County the amount necessary to pay the interest with a proportionate amount necessary to be levied in such year for sinking fund purposes, so that the interest on such bonds shall be paid as the same accrues and a sinking fund provided for, sufficient to discharge the principal on said bonds when same become due, and said county auditor shall compute and ascertain the rate of levy necessary to provide therefor, in each year, and shall place the same upon the duplicate for the year for which it is certified, and in addition to all other levies.

Sec. 4. The committee on finance is hereby directed to have said bonds and coupons properly prepared and executed, to sell the same and to deposit the proceeds in the city treasury in a fund to be designated as the Cypress Avenue Storm Sewer Fund, and for which purpose same is hereby appropriated.

Sec. 5. That An Ordinance No. 27127, passed September 8, 1913, "To provide for the issue of bonds to pay the cost and expense of constructing a sewer in Cypress Avenue, from Bellows Avenue to Mound Street," is hereby repealed.

Sec. 6. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 27664—To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Scott Street, from Sandusky Street to Glenwood Avenue.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus, state of Ohio:

Section 1. That for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Scott Street, from Sandusky Street to Glenwood Avenue, by grading, draining, curbing, paving the roadway with brick, and laying water service pipe, in said city, in pursuance of Ordinance No. 27358, passed May 26, 1913, bonds of said city shall be issued to the amount of eighteen thousand dollars.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the mayor and auditor; bear date not later than March 1, 1914, and be due and payable March 1, 1925. They shall be of the denomination of \$1000.00 each, and numbered from one to eighteen, both inclusive. They shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent per

annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of March and September of each year, and for which the proper interest coupons, bearing a facsimile of the signature of the auditor, shall be attached and made part of said bonds. Principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the treasurer of the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Sec. 3. For the purpose of paying the interest on the bonds herein authorized and providing a sinking fund for their final redemption at maturity, the trustees of a sinking fund of the city of Columbus shall annually certify to the auditor of Franklin county the amount necessary to pay the interest with a proportionate amount necessary to be levied in such year for sinking fund purposes so that the interest on such bonds shall be paid as the same accrues and a sinking fund provided for, sufficient to discharge the principal of said bonds when the same become due, and that said county auditor shall compute and ascertain the rate of levy necessary to provide therefor, in each year, and shall place the same upon the duplicate for the year for which it is certified and in addition to all other levies.

Sec. 4. The committee on finance of this council is hereby directed to have said bonds and coupons properly prepared and executed, to sell the same and to deposit the proceeds in the city treasury in a fund to be designated as the Scott St., Sandusky to Glenwood Fund, for the purpose of paying the portion of the cost of said improvement not heretofore provided to be paid by said city, and for which purpose said money is hereby appropriated.

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Section 1. That the plat of dedication of Wall Street, from Mechanics Avenue to Markison Avenue, dedicating to the city of Columbus a parcel of land twenty feet in width, for street purposes, be and the same is hereby approved and accepted.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 27666—To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Ellsworth Avenue, from Livingston Avenue to north line Bohlander's Subdivision.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus, state of Ohio:

Section 1. That for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Ellsworth Avenue, from Livingston Avenue to north line of Bohlander's Subdivision, by grading, draining, curbing, paving the roadway with asphalt and brick gutters and laying water service pipe in said city, in pursuance of Ordinance No. 27377, passed June 2, 1913, bonds of said city shall be issued to the amount of ten thousand dollars.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the mayor and auditor; bear date not later than March 1, 1914, and be due and payable March 1, 1925. They shall be of the denomination of \$1000.00 each, and numbered from one to ten, both inclusive. They shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of March and September of each year, and for which the proper interest coupons, bearing a facsimile of the signature of the auditor, shall be attached and made part of said bonds. Principal and interest shall be payable at

the office of the treasurer of the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Sec. 3. For the purpose of paying the interest on the bonds herein authorized and providing a sinking fund for their final redemption at maturity, the trustees of a sinking fund of the city of Columbus shall annually certify to the auditor of Franklin County the amount necessary to pay the interest with a proportionate amount necessary to be levied in such year for sinking fund purposes so that the interest on such bonds shall be paid as the same accrues and a sinking fund provided for, sufficient to discharge the principal of said bonds when the same become due, and that said county auditor shall compute and ascertain the rate of levy necessary to provide therefor, in each year, and shall place the same upon the duplicate for the year for which it is certified and in addition to all other levies.

Sec. 4. The committee on finance of this council is hereby directed to have said bonds and coupons properly prepared and executed, to sell the same and to deposit the proceeds in the city treasury in a fund to be designated as the Ellsworth Av., Livingston, to N. L. Bohlander's Fund, for the purpose of paying the portion of the cost of said improvement not heretofore provided to be paid by said city, and for which purpose said money is hereby appropriated.

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

RESOLVED, By the council of the city of Columbus, state of Ohio:

(a) That it is necessary to construct a sewer in the alley west of Taylor Avenue, from the alley north of Harvard Avenue to north terminus and continuing via right of way to Atcheson Street; also in Rosethorne Street, from the alley west of Taylor Avenue to Johnson Street in the city of Columbus, Ohio; in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles of the proposed improvement prepared by the chief engineer, which are hereby approved;

(b) That the grade of sewer as constructed shall be as shown on the plans and profiles.

(c) That the whole cost of said improvement, less one-fiftieth thereof and the cost of intersections, shall be assessed in proportion to the special benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to wit: A1 lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement, and in amount equal to the cost thereof;

(d) That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five annual installments, with interest on deferred payments at a rate not exceeding six per cent per annum; provided that the owner of any property assessed may, at his option, pay such assessment or any number of installments of the same at any time after such assessment has been levied, with interest to the semi-annual interest day of said bonds next following date of payment;

(e) That bonds of the city of Columbus, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments by installments, and in an amount equal thereto;

(f) That the remainder of the entire cost of said improvement shall be paid by the issuance of bonds in the manner provided by law.
