AN ORDINANCE No. 279-44 To vacate the first alley north of Fifth avenue from the west line of Penny street to the west line of the alley west of Penny street, and the alley west of Penny street from the north line of the first alley north of Fifth avenue to the south line of English alley.

Whereas, a petition, signed by the owners of all the lots and lands abutting upon the first alley north of Fifth avenue from the west line of Penny street to the west line of the alley west of Penny street, and the alley west of Penny street from the north line of the first alley north of Fifth avenue to the south line of English alley, was duly presented to this council praying and consenting that said alleys, between the points named, be vacated, and

Whereas, council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for and that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the first alley north of Fifth avenue from the west line of Penny street to the west line of the alley west of Penny street, and the alley west of Penny street from the north line of the first alley north of Fifth avenue to the south line of English alley be and the same are hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right and privilege to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by said city, and that the right to operate, replace and maintain all other public utilities, including telephone, telegraph and electrical conduits, poles and lines, gas lines, water lines and sewer lines, now existing in or upon said alleys so vacated be and they are hereby reserved unto the owners thereof, and all of such owners, including the city of Columbus, shall have the right and privilege to enter thereon for the purpose of operating, replacing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, upon the acceptance in writing of each and all of the terms and provisions of this ordinance by the owners of the abutting properties, and the payment of the cost of publication hereof.

AN ORDINANCE No. 280-44 To vacate the second alley north of Innis avenue from the east line of Washington avenue to the west line of the second alley west of Parsons avenue.

Whereas, a petition signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the second alley north of Innis avenue from the east line of Washington avenue to the west line of the second alley west of Parsons avenue was duly presented to this council, praying and consenting that said alley, between the limits named, be vacated, and

Whereas, upon hearing, this council is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the second alley north of Innis avenue from the east

line of Washington avenue to the west line of the second alley west of Parsons avenue be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate, maintain and replace any and all sewers, water lines and other public utilities owned by said city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any and all other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley to be vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for such purposes.

Sec. 3. That the abutting property owners shall deposit with the city treasurer, to the credit of maintenance and repair No. 65 trust fund, a sum of money sufficient to cover the cost of eliminating the paved intersection on Washington avenue and replacing the straight curb and sidewalk, where necessary.

Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, upon the filing with the clerk of this council the acceptance, in writing, of each and all of the terms and provisions of this ordinance by the owners of the above mentioned property and the payment of the cost of publication hereof.

AN ORDINANCE No. 296-44 To provide for the rental of office and storage space in the city hall building to department No. 65, street maintenance and repair, and department No. 72-A, sewers and drains; to establish the rates therefor and authorize payment thereof.

Whereas, the division of engineering and construction, operating through department No. 65, street maintenance and repair, and department No. 72-A, sewers and drains, occupies 3,429.5 square feet of floor space in the basement and 7,247 square feet of floor space on the third and fourth floors of the city hall building, and

Whereas, such departments are properly chargeable for the space so occupied; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the rental charge of \$1.00 per square foot of basement floor space per annum, and \$1.50 per square foot of third and fourth floors floor space per annum in the city hall building be and they are hereby established for occupancy by department No. 65, street maintenance and repair, and department No. 72-A, sewers and drains.

Sec. 2. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to render his bills against sewers and drains No. 72-A-B-44 fund in the amount of \$4,800.00, being for the rental of 1,351.5 square feet of basement floor space and 2,299 square feet of third and fourth floors floor space, and against the maintenance and repair No. 65-B-44 fund in the amount of \$9,500.00, being for the rental of 2,078 square feet of basement floor space and 4,948 square feet of third floor floor space in the city hall building for the year ending December 31, 1944.

Sec. 3. That, upon receipt of said bills, the chief engineer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his vouchers, in the proper amounts, against the said funds and credit the general fund, otherwise known as the fund for general purposes.

Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of parks and forestry, in that it is necessary to purchase equipment to expedite the cutting and marketing of trees for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, now, therefore,

That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into contract for the purchase of electric saw equipment, complete with generator, cable and cutter chains for the division of parks and forestry in accordance with or equal to specifications of such equipment, in the office of the director of public service.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$2,625, or so much thereof as may be needed, be and the same is hereby appropriated from the division of parks and forestry, code 700, to pay the cost thereof.

AN ORDINANCE No. 304-44 To grant permission to the Jr. Board of the Hannah Neil Mission to use rubbish containers for advertising purposes.

Whereas, the Jr. Board of the Hannah Neil Mission has offered to paint and service the present rubbish containers on the city's streets and to provide additional rubbish containers as may be necessary to keep the streets clean, without cost to the city, for the privilege of certain advertising rights; and

Whereas, the proceeds obtained from the proposition will be used to help maintain the Hannah Neil Mission for charitable purposes; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Jr. Board of the Hannah Neil Mission be and they are hereby granted permission to use the present rubbish containers now in service and the right to purchase and place in service at the expense of the Jr. Board of the Hannah Neil Mission such other rubbish containers as in their opinion to be necessary to keep the streets of the city clean, said permission being granted under the following conditions:

(a) That the rubbish containers shall be painted and serviced, as well as insured, by the Jr. Board of the Hannah Neil Mission, and shall be emp-
