

"Sec. 1276-15. Parking—Both Sides, Prohibited. The parking of vehicles on both sides of the following streets and alleys between points mentioned is prohibited:

- Broad street, first alley north of; High to Pearl.
- Chapel street, Townsley court to point 100 feet west.
- Chapel street, High to Pearl.
- Eureka avenue, Broad to point 30 feet south.
- Fifteenth avenue, High to point 50 feet east.
- Gay street, first alley north of; Front to Wall.
- Grant avenue, first alley west of; Town to State.
- Oakley avenue, Broad to point 30 feet south.
- Park avenue, Broad to point 30 feet south.
- Pearl street, Thirteenth avenue to Sixteenth avenue.
- Pearl street, Chittenden avenue to Twelfth avenue.
- Pearl street, Naghten street to Mound street.
- Wall street, Naghten street to Mound street."

Sec. 2. That sections 1276-13 and 1276-15 of the Columbus code of 1930, as established by ordinance No. 92-33, passed April 3, 1933, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. That ordinances No. 264-33, passed September 11, 1933, and 273-33, passed September 25, 1933, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 282-33—To change the zoning map attached to ordinance No. 38,852, passed February 27, 1928, and as subsequently amended as herein provided.

Section 1. Whereas, in order to provide more adequate traffic facilities to the western section of the city and to relieve traffic conditions in the downtown section of said city, it is necessary to construct the Main street bridge across the Scioto river and the approaches thereto, and

Whereas, the estimated cost and expense of constructing said Main street bridge and approaches thereto and acquiring the necessary land and rights-of-way therefore is \$500,000, and

Whereas, under the provisions of the National Industrial Recovery Act, the federal government has been requested to make a grant to the city in the amount of thirty per cent of the cost of labor and materials, said grant to be applied to the total cost of construction, and

Whereas, it is necessary to issue and sell bonds for the purpose of raising funds to pay the city's part of the cost and expense of constructing said bridge and approaches thereto, and acquiring the necessary rights-of-way therefore in the sum of \$400,000; now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Columbus:

That it is necessary to issue and sell bonds for the purpose of raising funds to pay the city's part of the cost and expense of constructing the Main street bridge across the Scioto river and approaches thereto, and acquiring the necessary land and rights-of-way therefore in the sum of \$400,000, said amount representing that part of the total cost of the project which the city will bear, the balance of the cost being borne by the United States under the provisions of the National Industrial Recovery Act, enacted by the seventy-third congress of the United States on June 13, 1933, which provides that the president may make grants to states, municipalities or other public bodies for the construction, repair or improvement of various projects, but that no such grant shall be in excess

of thirty per centum of the cost of labor and materials employed on such projects for the specific improvement above named and further declaring it necessary to levy a tax outside the fifteen mill limitation prescribed by law to pay the interest on and retire said bonds at maturity. The approximate date of such bonds shall be March 1, 1934, and the interest rate thereof four per cent per annum; they shall be issued serially and shall mature in twenty equal annual installments of substantially \$20,000 each, beginning on the approximate date of August 1, 1940, the maturity of the earliest installment being fixed at not later than five years after the earliest possible date of maturity, as provided in sub. senate bill No. 38, passed by the general assembly of the state of Ohio on September 20, 1933, and approved by the governor of the state of Ohio on September 22, 1933.

Be it further resolved that the question of issuing said bonds of said city for said purpose in the sum of \$400,000 and the levying of the tax outside the fifteen mill limitation prescribed by law to pay the interest on and retire said bonds, be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of said city at an election to be held in said city on the seventh day of November, 1933.

That this bond issue is submitted pursuant to the aforesaid National Industrial Recovery Act and pursuant to amended senate bill No. 403 passed by the general assembly of the state of Ohio on July 1, 1933 and approved by the governor of the state of Ohio on July 18, 1933 as amended by the aforesaid sub. senate bill No. 38.

That in pursuance of section 2293-19 (as modified by the provisions of the aforesaid sub. senate bill No. 38) of the general code of Ohio, the clerk of this council be and he is hereby directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the county auditor of Franklin county, Ohio, at least thirty days prior to said November election and
