Sec. 4. That the sum of \$3450.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the street improvement and intersection fund to pay the remainder of the cost of said improvement.

Sec. 5. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in ten annual installments, with interest on deferred payments at a rate not exceeding six per cent per annum; provided, that the owner of any property assessed may, at his option, pay such assessments or any number of installments thereof at any time after said assessment has been levied, with interest to the semi-annual interest day of said bonds next following date of payment.

Sec. 6. That bonds of the city of Columbus, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by installments, and in an amount equal thereto.

Sec. 7. That the director of public service be and is hereby authorized and directed to make and execute contract for said improvement with the lowest and best bidder after advertising according to law.

Sec. 8. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 28662—Determining to proceed with the improvement of Eighteenth Street, from Long Street to Mt. Vernon Avenue, in the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus, state of Ohio:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Eighteenth Street, from Long Street to Mt. Vernon Avenue, by grading, draining, curbing, repaving the roadway with asphalt and brick gutters, and laying water service pipe, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, in accordance with the resolution declaring it necessary to improve said thoroughfare adopted by council March 16, 1915, and in accordance with the plans, profiles, specifications and estimate of cost therefor approved and now on file in the office of the department of public service.

Sec. 2. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after completion of the proposed improvement, and the city solicitor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Sec. 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, together with interest on bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments to be levied for said improvement and all other necessary expenditures, less one-half thereof and the cost of intersections, shall be assessed in proportion to the special benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All lots and lands fronting, bounding or abutting upon the proposed improvements, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement in the amount of cost thereof.

Sec. 4. That the sum of \$5600.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the street improvement and intersection fund, to pay the remainder of the cost of said improvement.

Sec. 5. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in ten annual

installments with interest on deferred payments at a rate not exceeding six per cent per annum; provided, that the owner of any property assessed may, at his option, pay such assessments or any number of installments thereof, at any time after said assessment has been levied, with interest to the semi-annual interest day of said bonds next following date of payment.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 28717—To levy a special assessment upon the lots and land benefited by the construction of a sewer upon the lines therein mentioned.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus, state of Ohio:

Section 1. That the assessment of the cost and expense of constructing a sewer in Dodridge Street from the intercepting sewer to Neil Avenue; Neil Avenue from Dodridge Street to North Street; North Street, from Neil Avenue to High Street; alley north of Dodridge Street from High Street to the alley west of Findlay Avenue, thence north to Arcadia Avenue, thence east to Findlay Avenue; alley north of Dodridge Street, from Neil Avenue to east terminus; alley west of High Street, from Dodridge Street to North Street and High Street from Dodridge Street to North Street, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, as reported to the council on March 29, 1915, by the estimating board heretofore appointed for that purpose, and which report was filed in the office of the city clerk on March 29, 1915, be and the same is hereby confirmed, and that there be and hereby is levied and assessed upon the lots and land described in said report, the several amounts as herein set forth. It is hereby determined and declared that each of said lots and lands are specially benefited by said improvement and in amount equal to said assessment.

Sec. 2. That the total assessment shall be payable at the office of the city treasurer of Columbus, Ohio, within a period of thirty (30) days from date of the first publication of this ordinance with interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent from the first day of March, 1915, or at the option of the owner in ten annual installments with interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent per annum upon deferred payments at the office of the county treasurer after the same has been certified to the county auditor for collection in the manner provided by law. The said assessment, after being so certified may, however, be paid in full or in any number of annual installments at any tax collection time, with interest on same to semi-annual interest day next ensuing. If said installments of said assessment be not paid when same become due, a penalty will be imposed and collected, as provided by law.

Sec. 3. That the said assessment and all portions thereof when collected shall be paid into the sinking fund, and shall be applied to the payment of the bonds issued for said improvement and the interest thereon as the same shall become due, and to no other purpose whatsoever.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 28683—Authorizing and directing the director of public service to contract for certain things herein named in connection with the Scioto River Pumping Station.

That the director of public service be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into and execute contracts according to law for removing boilers from the Main Sewage Pumping Station and setting them up at the Scioto River Pumping Station, for furnishing all equipment necessary to attach said boilers to the new engine, for installing steam and water mains and mechanical stokers at said Scioto River Pumping Station, and to issue his requisition on the auditor against the Public Service—6 fund, to pay the consideration for the same in a sum not to exceed \$17,000.00.
