COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Reg. Meeting, Wednesday, Feb. 9, 1944.
(No. 9)

Council met in regular session with President Jones in the chair. Roll call showed the following members present: Messrs. Ballin, Benson, Dailey, Hale, Oestreicher and President Jones (6). Mr. Hauntz being absent.

Council recessed to Monday, February 14, 1944 at 6:45 p. m.

Council reconvened Monday, Feb. 14, 1944 at 6:45 p. m., with President Jones in the chair. Roll call showed all members present.

Council met in regular session with President Jones in the chair. Roll call showed all members present.

Mrs. Charles S. Druggan submitted a communication, acknowledging appreciation of expression of sympathy extended by members of city council on the death of Mr. Charles S. Druggan. Placed on file.

The division of sewage treatment submitted results of operation of the sewage treatment works for the week ending February 4, 1944. Placed on file.

Mrs. Rose Hull submitted claim on behalf of her daughter, Margaret Hull, for personal injuries. Judiciary.

R. A. Witchey, 2661 Wexford Road, submitted claim for damage to automobile. Judiciary.

American Aggregates Corporation submitted a communication requesting permission to excavate sand and gravel from two tracts of land located on the east bank of the Scioto river, south of the municipal bridge. Service.

Robert N. Tucker, superintendent of the division of electricity, submitted a report in connection with petition of Robert E. Johnson for street light at Johnson street and alley north of Atcheson street. Service.

By Mr. Hauntz, No. 70-44, to authorize the board of purchase to enter into a contract for the purchase of a billing machine for the division of water. Service.

By Mr. Hauntz, No. 71-44, to authorize and direct the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into a contract for the purchase of one accounting machine for use in the office of the city auditor. Service.

By Mr. Oestreicher, No. 73-44, to fix the number and salaries of the officers and employees in the division of police, department of public safety, and to repeal Ordinance No. 206-43, passed May 17, 1943. Safety.

ORDINANCES

AN ORDINANCE NO. 30-44 To vacate the alley south of Goodale street from Olentangy boulevard to Whetstone avenue.

Whereas, a petition signed by the owners of all the lots and lands abutting upon the alley south of Goodale

street, from the east line of Olentangy boulevard to Whetstone avenue, was duly presented to this council, praying and consenting that said alley between the points named be vacated, and

Whereas, council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for and that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley south of Goodale street, from the east line of Olentangy boulevard to the west line of Whetstone avenue, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by said city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any and all other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley to be vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of operating, replacing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, upon the acceptance in writing of each and all of the terms and provisions of this ordinance by the owners of the abutting properties, and the payment of the cost of publication hereof.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 43-44 To change the name of Carpenter street between Bryden road and Franklin avenue, and to name the first alley east of 18th street between Franklin avenue and Oak street.

Whereas, council is in receipt of a petition to change the name of Carpenter street between Bryden road and Oak street to 19th street, and

Whereas, the portion of said street between Franklin avenue and Oak street is not named; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the name of Carpenter street between Bryden road and Franklin avenue be and it is hereby changed to 19th street, and that the first alley east of 18th street between Franklin avenue and Oak street be and it is hereby named 19th street.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 48-44 To amend section 903-a of the Columbus Code of 1930, as amended by ordinance No. 347-42, passed July 13, 1942, and to repeal said section 903-a as so amended.

Whereas, an emergency exists during the national emergency in that it is necessary to change the opening and closing hours of pawn brokers for the immediate preservation of public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore,
