ORDINANCES PASSED.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 30,364—To amend section 2 of Ordinance No. 29,711, passed October 16, 1916, and to repeal said original section 2.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That section 2 of Ordinance No. 29,711, passed October 16, 1916, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 2. That there be and hereby are created the following positions to exist only during the work of construction: One general foreman of construction at \$150.00 per month; one clerk, who shall make and keep the cost and time records and act as storekeeper, at \$75.00 per month; line foremen at \$4.00 each per day or 50 cents per hour; linemen at \$3.50 per day or 43.75 cents per hour; groundmen at \$2.50 per day or 31.25 cents per hour; inside wiremen at \$3.50 per day or 43.75 per hour, and laborers at \$2.50 per day or 31.25 cents per hour, also a driver with a team at not to exceed \$6.00 per day.

Sec. 2. That said original section 2 of Ordinance No. 29,711, passed October 16, 1916, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 30,366—To make an additional appropriation in the sum of \$773.00 to Department No. 41-201,

Maintenance of Building Fund.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That from the moneys now in the fund known as the "Fund for Public Safety Purposes," otherwise known as the Public Safety Fund, and from all moneys estimated to come into said fund from any and all sources during the balance of the twelve months ending December 31, 1917, and not otherwise appropriated, there be and there hereby is appropriated to the use of Department No. 41, 201, Maintenance of Buildings Fund, the sum of \$773.00 for use during the balance of the said twelve months' period ending December 31, 1917.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 30,386—Authorizing the director of public service to advertise for bids and to enter into the necessary contract or contracts for repairing the city hall, and repealing An Ordinance No. 30,371, passed September 10, 1917.

Whereas, An emergency exists in that the city hall is badly in need of repair, the winter season with its rains and snows is near at hand and said building and the offices located therein will be greatly damaged if certain repairs are

not made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into the necessary contract or contracts for certain repairs to the city hall building, in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file in the office of the department of public service.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$3500.00 or so much thereof as may be needed be and the same is hereby appropriated from the No. 77 201 Fund to pay for said work.

Sec. 3. That Ordinance No. 30,371, passed September 10, 1917, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. That for the reason set forth in the preamble hereto, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure to take effect and to be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 30,392—Authorizing and directing the purchase of certain parcels of ground necessary for the flood protection improvement, and appropriating the money therefor.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. In accordance with options obtained by the city attorney and after approval by him of warranty deeds, the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to purchase the following described property for the flood protection improvement, upon the following terms, the parcels being numbered as they appear in the resolutions of July 9 and September 10, 1917, to which reference is made for the detailed descriptions:

Parcel No. 14, as described in the resolution of September 10, being .99 acres plus land heretofore dedicated for levee purposes, from Alma W. Paterson, for the sum of \$430.00, the city to assume the taxes hereafter falling due.

Parcel No. 33, as described in the resolution of July 9, being lot 22 of Walter Morrison's addition, from Jennie Davies, for the sum of \$875.00, the grantor to reserve the title to the buildings upon the condition that the same are removed by November 1 and the premises rendered safe, the city to pay the taxes falling due hereafter.
