Whereas a petition by the owners of all lots abutting on the alley described in the preamble hereto, was duly presented to council praying and consenting that said alley between the points named be vacated; and

Whereas, council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made; now, therefore,

AN ORDINANCE No. 305-34—To authorize the purchase of a right-of-way in, through and across the right-of-way of the New York Central Railroad company for the construction and maintenance of relief, sanitary and storm sewers contract No. 10, Woodland avenue sanitary sewer, section 1, appropriating the money therefor, and to execute an agreement in connection therewith.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operations of the department of public service, division of engineering, in that it is necessary to secure right-of-way for the construction of said sewer in order that the same may be done in conformity with the National Industrial Recovery Act, public works administration and for the immediate preservation of public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to purchase a right-of-way in, through and across the East Columbus branch of the New York Central railroad for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a sanitary sewer therein, including the right to clean, repair and care for said sewer and access thereto for said purposes in the following location to-wit:

Being on a line approximately 600 feet easterly from the east line of Nelson road as measured on the center line of the tracks of said railroad company; said right-of-way extending on a line at approximately 90 degrees with the center line of said track of said railroad company, from the New York Central Railroad company and any other corporation, firm, person or persons having an in-

terest therein, for the sum of \$100.

Sec. 2. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute an agreement with the New York Central Railroad company for the construction and maintenance of a sanitary sewer across the right-of-way of said New York Central Railroad company in the location above described, in accordance with the relief, sanitary and storm sewers contract No. 10, Woodland avenue sanitary sewer, section 1.

Sec. 3. That the sum of \$100 be and the same is hereby appropriated for relief, sanitary and storm sewers fund No. 1, docket No. 3946, for the payment of the purchase price of said right-of-way which shall be paid on voucher signed by the director of public service after execution by the director of public service and the railroad company of the agreement therefor, and approval of the same by the city attorney.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 306-34—To authorize the purchase of an easement in and through the property therein described for the purpose of the construction and maintenance of relief, sanitary and storm sewers contract No. 1, West Side relief sewer, main line—section 1, and appropriating the money therefor.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operations of the department of public service, division of engineering, in that it is necessary to secure right-of-way for the construction of said sewer in order that the same may be done in conformity with the National Industrial Recovery Act, public works administration and for the immediate preservation of public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to purchase an easement in and through the following described property for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a 78-inch relief, sanitary sewer therein, including the right to clean, repair and care for said sewer and access thereto for such purposes, together with the right to use only during the period of construction of said sewer, an additional strip of land along each side of the center lines of the strips of land hereinafter described to the extent of 25 feet each way from the center lines, except where said 25 feet on each side of the center lines would extend outside of or beyond the property lines of the tracts hereinafter described, in which case said additional strips shall extend only to said property lines, to-wit:

Situated in the township of Franklin, county of Franklin and state of Ohio, and being a tract of 13.50 acres as conveyed from Vina A. Dresbach to William Miller and described in deed of record in deed book 949, page 657, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio.

Being two strips of land 30 feet in width each across a portion of said 13.50 acre tract, the center lines of said 30 foot strips being more particularly described as follows:

Strip No. 1

Beginning at a point in the south line of said 13.50 acre tract, said point being 135 feet, more or less, measured along said south line easterly from the east line of Jackson pike (new location); thence in a northwesterly direction 182 feet, more or less, to a point in the east line of said Jackson pike (new location), said point being 163 feet, more or less, measured along the east line of said Jackson pike (new location) from the south line of said 13.50 acre tract.

Strip No. 2

Beginning at a point in the west line of Jackson pike (new location), said point being 160 feet, more or less, measured along said west line southerly from the north line of said 13.50 acre tract; thence in a northwesterly direction 182 feet, more or less, to a point in the north line of said 13.50 acre tract, said point being 136 feet, more or less, measured along said north line westerly from the west line of said Jackson pike (new location), from Mary H. Miller, Willis E. Miller and Anna F. Pearson, or any other person or persons having an interest therein, for the sum of \$1250.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$1250 be and the same is hereby appropriated from relief, sanitary and storm sewers fund No. 1, docket No. 1961, for the payment of the purchase price of said easement, which shall be paid on voucher signed by the director of public service after approval by the city attorney of the deed therefor.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 307-34—To authorize the purchase of an easement in and through the property therein described for the purpose of the construction and maintenance of relief, sanitary and storm sewers, contract No. 11, Beulah road district sanitary sewers, main line, and appropriating the money therefor.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operations of the department of public service, division of engineering, in that it is necessary to secure right-of-way for the construction of said sewer in order that the same may be done in conformity with the National Industrial Recovery Act, public works administration and for the immediate preservation of public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to purchase an easement in and through the following described property for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a sanitary sewer therein, including the right to clean, repair and care for said sewer and access thereto for such purposes, together with the right to use, only during the period of construction of said sewer, an additional strip of land along each side of the center line of the strip of land hereinafter described, to the extent of 25 feet each way from the said center line, except where said 25 feet on each side of said center line would extend outside of or beyond the property lines of the tracts hereinafter described, in which case said additional strips shall extend only to said property lines, to-wit:

Situated in the city of Columbus, county of Franklin and state of Ohio.

Being a strip of land 10 feet in width across a 22.24 acre tract, now owned by Eda H. Bower and Bertha Moon, and described in deed of record, in deed book 936, page 201, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, the center line of said strip being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the south line of said 22.24 acre tract 452 feet west of the west line of Beulah road as measured along the south line of said tract; thence in a northeasterly direction 223 feet to a point; thence left 32 degrees, 12 minutes 47.01 feet to a point; thence right 11 degrees, 22 minutes 25.9 feet, more or less, to a point on the south line of Weber road, which point is 202 feet, more or less, from the west line of Beulah road as measured along said south line of Weber road, from Eda H. Bower and Bertha Moon, or any other person or persons having
