### COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Recessed Meeting, Monday, September 24, 1945. 6:45 P. M.

Council met in regular session with President Jones in the Chair. The roll being called, the following members were present: Messrs. Ballin, Evans, Hale, Koontz and President Jones—5. Messrs. Fillinger and Oestreicher being absent.

### COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Regular Meeting, Monday, September 24, 1945. (No. 39) 7:00 P. M.

Council met in regular session with President Jones in the chair. The roll being called, the following members

were present: Messrs. Ballin, Evans, Fillinger, Hale, Koontz, Oestreicher and President Jones—7. Col. Ballin being excused account of illness.

The Columbus Rendering company, submitted acceptance of terms and conditions of an Ordinance No. 299-45, granting the right to continue the operation and maintenance of a railroad switch connecting with the municipal railway. Placed on file.

The Firemen's Benevolent association submitted acceptance of terms and conditions of a resolution adopted granting permission to place posters on light standards. Placed on file.

The division of recreation submitted supplement to annual report for the year 1944. Placed on file.

The Trustees of the Sinking Fund, W. H. Duffy, secretary, submitted acceptance of the tender of Sanitary Sewer, James road, alley south of Main street to a point south of Mound street, Note, Series No. 79, in the amount of \$4,500.00. Placed on file.

The division of municipal garage submitted monthly report for August, 1945. Placed on file.

R. P. Barthalow, city auditor, submitted summary of fund transactions for period August 31, 1945 to September 22, 1945. Placed on file.

The division of sewage treatment submitted results of operation of the sewage treatment works for the week ending September 14, 1945. Placed on file.

The Franklin County Board of Elections submitted revised notice of election on certain issue of bonds for November 6, 1945 election. Placed on file.

Earl D. Gaffin, 949 Campbell avenue, and approximately 150 others, submitted petition protesting the change in zoning of property bounded by the alley north of Mound street, Thomas avenue, alley east of Avondale avenue and the alley west of Dakota avenue. Service.

### ORDINANCES REFERRED

By Mr. Evans, No. 323-45, to grant E. A. Holton the right and privilege to construct, operate and maintain a spur railway track, at the established grade, upon and across the alley north of Swan street (Beaver alley). Service.

By Mr. Evans, No. 324-45, to provide for change in zoning of property being lots 228, 229 and 230 of Annex to Dennison Park addition, located on the south side of Sixth avenue between Perry and Tisdale streets from a dwelling to a business district. Service.

By Mr. Evans, No. 325-45, to provide for change in zoning of property being both sides of Monroe avenue between the alley north of Broad street and the north line of lots 33 and 35 of East Grove addition from an apartment to a dwelling district. Service.

### ORDINANCE LOST

By Mr. Evans, No. 300-45, to provide for change in zoning of property bounded by the alley north of Mound street, Thomas avenue, the alley east of Avondale avenue and the alley west of Dakota avenue, from a dwelling and business district to a first industrial district.

### ORDINANCES

**AN ORDINANCE No. 317-45**—To vacate the first and second alleys west of Holtzman avenue, from McAllister avenue to the alley north of Payne avenue, and the alley north of Payne avenue, from the first alley west of Holtzman avenue to the second alley west of Holtzman avenue.

Whereas, a petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the first and second alleys west of Holtzman avenue, from McAllister avenue to the alley north of Payne avenue, and the alley north of Payne avenue, from the first alley west of Holtzman avenue to the second alley west of Holtzman avenue, was duly presented to this council, praying and consenting that said street, between the limits named, be vacated, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition and that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the first and second alleys west of Holtzman avenue, from McAllister avenue to the alley north of Payne avenue, and the alley north of Payne avenue, from the first alley west of Holtzman avenue to the second alley west of Holtzman avenue, be and the same are hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by said city and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any and all other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said street to be vacated and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of operating, replacing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, upon the filing with the clerk of this council by the owners of the abutting property, their acceptance, in writing, of each and all of the terms and provisions of this ordinance and the payment of the cost of publication hereof.

AN ORDINANCE No. 326-45—To authorize payment of the claim of Carl C. Weaver, 127 S. Oakley avenue.

Whereas, while Carl C. Weaver's 1938 Ford Tudor automobile was parked in front of his house it was struck by a fire emergency squad car Sept. 2, 1945, causing great damage to the same; and

Whereas, through no fault of his own, the said Carl C. Weaver, has suffered damage in the amount of \$145.84 by reason of said accident; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the claim of Carl C. Weaver in the amount of \$145.84 for damage to his automobile sustained on September 2, 1945, as above set forth, be and the same is hereby recognized as a moral obligation of the city of Columbus.

Sec. 2. That for the purpose of paying said claim, there be and hereby is appropriated from general miscellaneous, No. 21-H fund, the sum of \$145.84.

Sec. 3. That the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the city treasurer in the sum of \$145.84 in payment of said claim, upon receipt of a voucher approved by the city attorney and a release properly executed by said Carl Weaver of all damage arising out of said accident.

Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 327-45—To provide for refund of application fee for gravity heating and air-conditioning license issued to Russell H. Mulder, 172 15th Ave.

Whereas, Russell H. Mulder paid the fee of \$10 for application for examination for license as gravity heating and air-condition contractor; and

Whereas, the license was not issued nor examination given on this application, which was filed at Auditor's office April 12, 1945; and

Whereas, it is the sense of this council that this said fee should be refunded; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the amount of \$10, the fee paid for application for gravity heating and air-condition license issued April 12, 1945, heretofore paid by Russell H. Mulder, be refunded to said Russell H. Mulder, and the City Auditor be and hereby is authorized and directed to draw his warrant in favor of the said Russell H. Mulder for the amount of \$10 and charge to 1945 general fund.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 328-45—To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into a contract for the purchase of license plates and identification tags necessary for the year 1946.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the city auditor's office in that it is immediately necessary to place an order for said license plates and tags so that same will be on hand January 1, 1946, now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for and open bids and enter into a contract for the purchase of license plates and identification tags, in accordance with the specifications on file in the office of said board of purchase.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$2500 or as much thereof as may be needed, be and is hereby appropriated from department No. 21-A, code B-1, to pay the cost thereof.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

## RESOLUTIONS

Whereas, this council on the 4th day of September, 1945, duly adopted a resolution providing for the submission to the electors of the city of Columbus, Ohio, at the election to be held on November 6, 1945, of the question of the issuance of bonds in the sum of \$650,000 for the purpose of raising funds to pay the city's portion of the cost and expense of improving the main thoroughfares set out in resolution of this council adopted September 4, 1945, by grading, draining, curbing, widening where necessary, paving the roadway and laying the necessary

water services and sewer connections, together with the city's portion of the cost of the necessary legal and administrative work and engineering, surveys, studies, plans, specifications, supervision of construction, inspection and testing, and of the levy of a tax to pay the interest on and retire said bonds at maturity; and

Whereas, the county auditor of Franklin county has certified to this council that in accordance with his calculation the average annual levy throughout the life of such bonds which will be required to pay the interest on and retire such bonds is .1587 mills for each one dollar of taxable valuation, which amounts to one and five hundred eighty-seven thousandths (1 and 587/1,000) of a cent for each one hundred dollars of taxable valuation; and

Whereas, in accordance with the provisions of law it is necessary to certify a copy of said resolution adopted September 4, 1945, and a copy of this resolution, to the board of elections of Franklin county, Ohio, more than forty days prior to the November, 1945 election in order that said bond issue may be voted on at said election; and

Whereas, there is insufficient time to comply with said provision of law unless this resolution is adopted as an emergency measure; and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of engineering and construction, in that it is immediately necessary to provide for the certification of said resolution of September 4, 1945, and this resolution, to the board of elections of Franklin county, Ohio, in order that said question may be submitted to the qualified electors voting at the November 6, 1945, election; now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Columbus:

That it is the desire of this council to proceed with the issuance of bonds in the sum of \$650,000 for the purpose of raising funds to pay the city's portion of the cost and expense of improving the main thoroughfares set out in resolution of this council adopted September 4, 1945, by grading, draining, curbing, widening where necessary, paving the roadway and laying the necessary water services and sewer connections, together with the city's portion of the cost of the necessary legal and administrative work and engineering, surveys, studies, plans, specifications, supervision of constructions, inspection and testing, and that the clerk of this council be and she is hereby directed to certify a copy of the resolution adopted by this council September 4, 1945, declaring it necessary to issue and sell bonds for said purpose and to provide for the submission of the question of issuing said bonds and levy of a tax therefor to a vote of the electors of said city to the board of elections of Franklin county, Ohio, together with a copy of this resolution setting forth the amount of the average annual tax levy as calculated by said county auditor, to-wit: .1587 mills for each one dollar of taxable valuation, which amounts to One and Five Hundred Eighty-seven Thousandths (1 and 587/1,000) of a cent for each one hundred dollars of taxable valuation, and the maximum number of years to retire said bonds, namely, ten years; and that said Board of Elections give notice of said election in accordance with Section 2293-21, General Code of Ohio.

Be it further resolved that the resolution adopted September 10, 1945 providing for the certification of the resolution of September 4, 1945 submitting the question of the issuance of said bonds to a vote of the people, together with said resolution of September 10, 1945, to the Board of Elections of Franklin County, Ohio, be and the same is hereby rescinded.

Be it further resolved, that for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this resolution is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take ef-
