AN ORDINANCE NO. 31,822—Authorizing the director of public service to lease the municipal asphalt plant for a certain purpose.

Whereas, The Cleveland Trinidad Paving Company is unable to complete the improvement of Broad street, between Third street and Fourth street, without a serious delay owing to the breaking down of its boiler and other necessary equipment, and said work can be completed only by permitting the said company to use the municipal asphalt plant for said work; and

Whereas, The need for the immediate completion of said work creates an emergency necessary for the protection of the public health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to permit the use by The Cleveland Trinidad Paving Company of the municipal asphalt plant, together with such fixtures and tools only as are necessary for the operation of the plant for the purpose of completing its contract for the improvement of East Broad street, from Third street to Fourth street, upon the following conditions: That said company shall immediately proceed with and complete said improvement at the earliest possible moment; that its use of said plant shall be subject to the supervision and orders of the chief engineer of said city; that it shall replace any parts of said plant or equipment broken during said company's use of said plant and fully reimburse the city for any other loss or damage; and that said company shall pay for the use of said plant the sum of six cents per square yard of completed pavement in said improvement as determined by the chief engineer, the total amount of which shall be deducted from the estimates.

Sec. 2. That the amount of this compensation shall be credited by the city auditor to the Street Repair Fund.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 31,823—To vacate the public alley between Eighteenth and Nineteenth streets, commencing at the south line of what is known as Gustavus or Parsons lane, running thence south to the north line of the first alley north of Bryden road, in the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Whereas, On the 22nd day of December, 1919, a petition by the person owning all the lots in the immediate vicinity of, and abutting upon the public alley between Eighteenth and Nineteenth streets and parallel therewith, and commencing at the south line of what is commonly

known as Gustavus or Parsons lane, and running thence south to the north line of the first alley north of Bryden road, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, was duly presented to council, praying that said public alley between the points named, be vacated; and filed therewith was a written consent to such vacation by all the owners of the property abutting said alley so proposed to be vacated; and,

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for, and that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the public alley lying between Eighteenth and Nineteenth streets in said city and parallel therewith, from the south line of what is commonly known as Gustavus or Parsons lane, to the north line of the first alley north of Bryden road, in said city, be, and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the right is hereby reserved in said city to keep, maintain, reconstruct and repair the sewer now located in said alley hereby vacated.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 31,824—To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the construction of a sewer, upon the lines therein mentioned, and to repeal an Ordinance No. 31,773, passed November 24, 1919.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the construction of a sewer in the alley north of Seventeenth avenue, from the alley east of Cleveland avenue to the C. A. & C. Ry.; Sixteenth avenue, from Cleveland avenue to the alley east; thence to the alley north; thence to the C. A. & C. Ry.; and in Fifteenth avenue, from Cleveland avenue to the alley east; thence to the alley north; thence to the C. A. & C. Ry. in said city, in pursuance of Ordinance No. 30,341, passed October 29, 1917, bonds of said city shall be issued to the amount of nine thousand dollars.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the mayor and auditor, bear date not later than March 1, 1920, and be due and payable March 1, 1927. They shall be of the denomination of \$1000 each, and numbered from one to nine, both inclusive. They shall bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of March and September of each year, and for which the proper interest coupons, bearing a facsimile of the signature of the auditor, shall be attached and made part of said bonds. Principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the treasurer of the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Sec. 3. For the purpose of paying the interest on the bonds herein authorized and providing a sinking fund for their final redemption at maturity, the trustees of a sinking fund of the city of Columbus shall annually certify to the auditor of Franklin county the amount necessary to pay the interest with a proportionate amount necessary to be levied in such year for sinking fund purposes so that the interest on such bonds shall be paid as the same accrues and a sinking fund provided for, sufficient to discharge the principal of said bonds when the same become due, and that said county auditor shall compute and ascertain the rate of levy necessary to provide therefor, in each year, and shall place the same upon the duplicate for the year for which it is certified and in addition to all other levies.

Sec. 4. The committee on finance of this council is hereby directed to have said bonds and coupons properly prepared and executed, to sell the same and to deposit the proceeds in the city treasury in a fund to be designated as the Grogan Sanitary No. 7 Sewers Fund, for the purpose of paying the portion of the cost of said improvement not heretofore provided to be paid by said city, and for which

purpose said money is hereby appropriated.

Sec. 5. That Ordinance No. 31,773, passed November 24, 1919, to issue bonds for said sewer, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 31,825—To authorize the director of public service to purchase certain real estate for the purpose of widening Fields avenue, from Yeoman street northwardly a distance of 125 feet.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to purchase in fee simple, free and clear of all encumbrances except the taxes and assessments to become due and payable on June 30, 1920, the following described real estate situate in the city of Columbus, Ohio, and being lot No. 16 of Thomas L. Brent's subdivision, for the sum of \$475.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$475 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the bond issue provided for in Ordinance No. 30,582, passed July 23, 1919, and designated as the Fields Avenue Widening Fund, for the payment of said consideration, which shall be paid on voucher signed by the director of public service, after approval by the city attorney, of deed therefor.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 31,827—To ratify the action of the board of purchase in buying two feed-water regulators and one 20 H. P. motor, and to authorize said board to purchase the necessary fittings for said water regulators and other equipment herein mentioned for the municipal electric light plant, and appropriating the money therefor.

Whereas, The board of purchase, believing that authority of council had been granted therefor, has purchased two feed-water regulators for the sum of \$125 each and one 20 H. P. motor for \$454.50; and

Whereas, It is necessary to purchase other supplies herein mentioned; and

Whereas, No ordinance authorizing said purchase has been passed and an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of the municipal electric light plant in that the use of said equipment is immediately necessary for the proper operation of said municipal electric light plant; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the action of the board of purchase in buying two feed-water regulators for the sum of \$125 each, and one 20 H. P. motor for the sum of \$454.50 for use in the division of the municipal electric light plant, be and the same is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Sec. 2. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized to purchase in the manner provided by law the fittings necessary for the said feed-water regulators in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file in the office of the director of public service; also 100 8-pin cross-arms; one oil circuit breaker, 600 ampere, 9000 volt, 4 pole, and operate remote control transformer trip, full automatic; and two 800 to 5 ampere current transformers, in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file in the office of the director of public service.

Sec. 3. That the sum of \$1175.24 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Municipal Electric Light Extension Fund No. 3-10, to pay the costs and expense thereof.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and
