

was certified, and in addition to all other levies.

Sec. 4. After said improvement is completed and the cost thereof ascertained, council shall by ordinance assess upon the benefited property in the manner provided in the legislation referring to said improvement and heretofore adopted by this council, the entire cost and expense thereof, and shall authorize and issue bonds in anticipation of the collection of said assessments in an amount substantially equal thereto, under the provisions of Section 189 of the charter. The proceeds from the sale of such bonds and any unexpended balance in the improvement fund remaining after the completion of said improvements, shall be used for the payment of the notes authorized by this ordinance and for no other purpose.

Sec. 5. That the faith and credit of the city of Columbus, Ohio, are hereby pledged for the payment of both principal and interest of the notes, hereinbefore described at maturity in accordance with the laws and constitution of the state of Ohio.

Sec. 6. The committee on finance of this council is hereby directed to have said notes properly prepared and executed, to sell the same as needed and to deposit the proceeds in the city treasury to the credit of the fund hereinbefore named for the purpose of paying the portion of the cost of said improvement not heretofore provided to be paid by the said city, and for which purpose said money is hereby appropriated.

Sec. 7. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

Whereas, what is known as Contract No. 6 for the enlargement of the water purification works was made and entered into July 7, 1921, by and between the city of Columbus, Ohio, and the Pitt Construction Company; and

Whereas, the Pitt Construction Company requested certain modifications with respect to the manner of doing the work which in its judgment would facilitate the progress of the work; and

Whereas, the director of public service of the city of Columbus, Ohio, made and entered into a modification of said contract with the Pitt Construction Company by which Sections 6.2 and 6.3 of said contract are modified so that the contractor is permitted to remove the earth backing from those portions of the east wall of the existing filtered water reservoir which extend back 54 feet on either side of the pipe gallery and to build the adjacent structures without completing the work on the remaining portions of the wall by continuous operations; provided that said contractor shall properly support such wall to insure its safety, such supports to be placed ahead of the bulk excavation of the earth backing against the wall if the water is not drawn down in the reservoir compartment adjoining, and with the understanding that the city will not draw down the water in the reservoir while the work on these portions of the wall is in progress, if such drawing down would interfere with the demands of the city's water supply at that time; the specifications as originally written shall be in full force for all the remaining portions of this wall, so that the modification herein provided for shall apply only to the 54-foot section; there is to be no increase in the cost to the city by reason of this modification and the contractor is to repair and restore said wall in case of injury, at its own cost and expense; now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Columbus:

That the action of the director of public service in executing said contract of modification of Sections 6.2 and 6.3 of said contract No. 6 for the enlargement of the water purification works made and entered into July 7, 1921, by and between the city of Columbus, Ohio, and the Pitt Construction Company, be and the same is hereby approved, ratified and confirmed.
