

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the mayor and auditor; bear date not later than December 1, 1921, and be due and payable December 1, 1941. They shall be of the denomination of \$1000 each, and numbered from one to two hundred, both inclusive. They shall bear interest at the rate of five and one-half per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of June and December of each year, and for which the proper interest coupons, bearing a fac-simile of the signature of the auditor, shall be attached and made part of said bonds. Principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the agency of the city of Columbus, Ohio, in New York City.

Sec. 3. For the purpose of paying the interest on the bonds herein authorized and providing a sinking fund for their final redemption at maturity, the trustees of a sinking fund of the city of Columbus shall annually certify to the auditor of Franklin county the amount necessary to pay the interest with a proportionate amount necessary to be levied in such year for sinking fund purposes so that the interest on such bonds shall be paid as the same accrues and a sinking fund provided for, sufficient to discharge the principal of said bonds when the same becomes due, and that said county auditor shall compute and ascertain the rate of levy necessary to provide therefor, in each year, and shall place the same upon the duplicate for the year for which it is certified and in addition to all other levies.

Sec. 4. The committee on finance of this council is hereby directed to have said bonds and coupons properly prepared and executed, to sell the same and to deposit the proceeds in the city treasury in a fund to be designated as the street improvement and intersection No. 70 fund.

Sec. 5. The director of public service is hereby authorized and directed to enter upon and execute the necessary contracts to carry out the purposes of this ordinance, and to issue his requisition upon the auditor against the fund herein established, to pay the consideration for the same.

Sec. 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 32,832—To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the construction of a sewer upon the lines therein mentioned.

Whereas, By Ordinance No. 32,451, passed February 28, 1921, bonds in the sum of \$28,000 were issued for said purpose, which amount has been found to be insufficient, and it is necessary to issue additional bonds therefor in the sum of \$1,500; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the construction of a sewer in Hayden Park drive, from Alum creek to Monticello place; between Hayden Park drive and Nelson road, from Avolon place to Monticello place; Monticello place, from a point between Hayden Park drive and Nelson road to Nelson road; Nelson road, from Monticello place to Ridgeway avenue; alley north of Fifth avenue, from Nelson road to Walcutt avenue; alley west Walcutt avenue, from Ridgeway avenue to Fifth avenue; alley north of Fifth avenue, from the first to the second alley west of Walcutt avenue; alley east of Sunbury avenue, from Ridgeway avenue to the alley north of Ridgeway avenue; alley east of Sunbury avenue, from Fifth avenue to the alley north of Margaret avenue; alley north of Margaret avenue, from Sunbury avenue to Nelson road; alley north of Wilshire avenue, from Kent street to the alley west of Nelson road; Walcutt avenue, from the alley north of Wilshire avenue to Margaret avenue; alley north of Dartmouth avenue from the alley west of Nelson road to Malvern avenue; alley north of Dartmouth avenue from the alley west of Malvern avenue to the alley east of Sunbury avenue; alley east of Sunbury avenue, from Wilshire avenue to the B. & O. R. R.; Sylvia avenue, from Kent street to the alley west of Cumberland street; alley north of Sylvia avenue, from the alley west of Nelson road to Malvern avenue; alley west of Nelson road, from Sylvia avenue to

the alley north of Wilshire avenue; Dartmouth avenue, from the alley west of Malvern avenue to Cumberland street; Cumberland street, from Dartmouth avenue to the alley north of Sylvia avenue; the alleys east and west of Kent street, from Sylvia avenue to B. & O. R. R.; Pike street, from Sylvia avenue to B. & O. R. R.; Malvern avenue, from Sylvia avenue to Wilshire avenue; Wilshire avenue, from Malvern avenue to Walcutt avenue; Dartmouth avenue, from Kent street to the alley west of Malvern avenue, in said city, in pursuance of Ordinance No. 32,378, passed January 24, 1921, bonds of said city shall be issued to the amount of fifteen hundred dollars.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the mayor and auditor; bear date not later than December 1, 1921, and be due and payable September 1, 1926. It shall be of the denomination of \$1500, and numbered twenty-nine. It shall bear interest at the rate of five and one-half percent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of March and September of each year, and for which the proper interest coupons, bearing a fac-simile of the signature of the auditor, shall be attached and made a part of said bond. Principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the treasurer of the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Sec. 3. For the purpose of paying the interest on the bond herein authorized and providing a sinking fund for its final redemption at maturity, the trustees of a sinking fund of the city of Columbus shall annually certify to the auditor of Franklin county the amount necessary to pay the interest with a proportionate amount necessary to be levied in such year for sinking fund purposes so that the interest on such bond shall be paid as the same accrues and a sinking fund provided for, sufficient to discharge the principal of said bond when the same becomes due, and that said county auditor shall compute and ascertain the rate of levy necessary to provide therefor, in each year, and shall place the same upon the duplicate for the year for which it is certified and in addition to all other levies.

Sec. 4. The committee on finance of this council is hereby directed to have said bond and coupons properly prepared and executed, to sell the same and to deposit the proceeds in the city treasury in a fund to be designated as the Shepard Lateral Sewer Fund, for the purpose of paying the portion of the cost of said improvement not heretofore provided to be paid by said city, and for which purpose said money is hereby appropriated.

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 32,842—To vacate a portion of East Second avenue east of the Toledo, Columbus & Ohio River railroad as hereinafter fully described.

Whereas, On the 24th day of September, 1921, a petition signed by all owners of the property abutting upon a portion of East Second avenue, hereinafter fully described, was duly presented to council consenting to and praying that said portion of said Second avenue be vacated; and,

Whereas, Council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for and that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That that portion of East Second avenue in the city of Columbus, described as follows:

Being a part of lot No. 16, partition of Robert Neil's estate, lying between the north line of East Second avenue as now laid out and improved, and the north line of said East Second avenue as formerly laid out before the grade crossing elimination improvement, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the east right of way line of the Toledo, Columbus & Ohio River railroad said point being the intersection of the said east right of way line and the north line of said Second avenue as laid out before said grade crossing elimination improvement west of the C. C. C. & St. L. railway, and being 57.94 feet, more or less,

south of the northwest corner of said lot No. 16; thence eastwardly along the said north line of East Second avenue as formerly laid out 107.6 feet, more or less, to a point; thence southwardly along a line parallel to the east line of lot No. 16, 54.12 feet, more or less, to a point in the north line of said East Second avenue as formerly laid out; thence eastwardly along said north line of said East Second avenue as formerly laid out 177.77 feet, more or less, to a point in the east line of said lot No. 16; thence southwardly along the east line of said lot No. 16, 31.4 feet, more or less, to a point in the north line of East Second avenue as laid out and improved; thence westwardly along said north line of East Second avenue as now laid out and improved 283.7 feet, more or less, to a point in the east right of way line of the Toledo, Columbus & Ohio River railroad; thence northwardly along the said east right of way line of said railroad company 51.6 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That said city of Columbus hereby reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers and water lines now existing on said portion of said avenue and to enter thereon for the purpose of operating, repairing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 32,845—To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into a contract for the purchase of one Ford five-passenger automobile for use in the treasury department, and to trade in one five-passenger Ford touring car now used in said department.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized to advertise for bids and enter into contract for the purchase of one five-passenger automobile, according to plans and specifications therefor on file in the office of said board of purchase, for use in the treasury department.

Sec. 2. That one certain 1914 model, five-passenger Ford touring car now in use in said department is not needed for any municipal purpose and said board of purchase is hereby authorized to trade in said Ford touring car and to receive a credit therefor on the purchase price of the new automobile, the purchase of which is authorized in section 1 hereof.

Sec. 3. That from moneys now in the fund known as the fund for general purposes, otherwise known as the general fund, and from all moneys estimated to come into said fund from any and all sources during the balance of the year 1921, and not otherwise appropriated, there be and there is hereby appropriated to department No. 5-700 fund, outfit equipment, the sum of \$450.

Sec. 4. That the sum of \$675, or so much thereof, as required, is hereby appropriated from department No. 5-700 fund, for use in purchasing the above mentioned automobile.
