Hardy, for all personal injuries and damages arising out of said accident.

ORD. No. 17-66—To authorize payment of a bill incurred in 1965, and to declare an emergency. Project No. 320-16.

Whereas, Mason & Isabel, Inc., general contractors for the construction of Windsor Ave. Swimming Pool, had to lower the bath house footers in order to expedite construction of said pool, and

Whereas, said services were performed at the cost of \$270.00 without approval from Council, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Recreation in that it is immediately necessary to obtain authority to pay said moral obligation for the preservation of public health, peace, property, safety, and welfare; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1.
