AN ORDINANCE No. 323-43—To fix the number and salaries of the officers and employees in the division of water, department of public service, and to repeal ordinance No. 162-43, passed April 12, 1943.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of water, department of public service, in that it is necessary to fix the number of officers and employees, and the salaries therefor to conform to the standardization and classification and salary rates set forth and approved in ordinance No. 484-41, passed July 28, 1941; and any and all amendments thereto, for the immediate preservation of public peace, property, health and safety; now, therefore;

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus: Section 1. That the number and salaries of the officers and employees of the division of water, department of public service, be and the same are hereby fixed as follows:

Table with 5 columns: No., Title, Minimum Per Month, After 1st Year, After 3rd Year, After 4th Year. Lists various positions like Superintendent, Chief chemist, Chief engineer, etc., with their respective salaries.

Table with 5 columns: Title, 1st Year, 3rd Year, 4th Year, 5th Year. Lists positions like Maintenance mechanics, Oilers, Stationary firemen, etc., with their respective salaries.

(AIC)—Assigned in charge. (HU)—House and utilities. Provided that the director of public service, with the consent of the civil service commission, may designate employees in the following classifications as "assigned in charge" for temporary supervisory duty and at the indicated increase in monthly pay during the period so assigned, to-wit:

Table listing salaries for various roles: Senior operating engineer (\$15 per month), Maintenance mechanic (\$15 per month), Senior addressograph operator (\$15 per month), etc.

Sec. 2 That the salaries and wages herein provided shall be paid from appropriate funds and that there is hereby appropriated from such funds the money necessary for the payment of such salaries.

Provided further, however, that such of those employees receiving an hourly wage, as may be practical, may have one afternoon off each week and still work 48 hours per week and receive pay therefor, provision may be made by the director of public service for such employees to work more than eight hours but not more than nine hours per day for five days, and for one day in each week the difference between 48 hours and the previous five-day accumulated hours. In the event an employee chooses to work on the above basis, he shall not be entitled to any increase in rate of pay for the regularly scheduled daily overtime.

Sec. 3. That ordinance No. 162-43, passed April 12, 1943, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. That for the reason stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

\* AN ORDINANCE No. 332-43—To vacate a strip of land twelve feet in width off the east side of West street beginning at the north right-of-way line of the Pennsylvania Railroad and extending northwardly to the south line of Randolph street. Whereas, on the 3rd day of August, 1943 a petition by owners of lots in the immediate vicinity of West street from the north right-of-way line of the Pennsylvania Railroad extending northwardly to the south line of Randolph street, was duly presented to council, praying that twelve feet off of the east side of said West street, between the points named, be vacated; and notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition has been given as required

by law by publication in the Ohio State Journal, a newspaper of general circulation in the corporation, for six consecutive weeks ending September 10, 1943; and Whereas, council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore, Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus: Section 1. That a strip of land twelve feet in width (measured at right angles to the east line of West street) off the east side of West street beginning at the north right-of-way line of the Pennsylvania Railroad and

extending northwardly to the south line of Chestnut street; thence from the north line of Chestnut street and extending northwardly to the south line of Randolph street, be and the same is hereby vacated. Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and other public utilities owned by said city and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any and all other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said street to be vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of operating, replacing and maintaining the same. Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall

take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, upon the payment by the petitioner herein of the cost of publication of this ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE No. 339-43—To levy re-assessment of certain delinquent special assessments.

Whereas, on July 26, 1943, the council of the city of Columbus, Ohio, adopted a resolution declaring the necessity of re-assessing certain delinquent special assessments, and

Whereas, pursuant to a publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the city of Columbus, Ohio, on August 30 and September 6, 1943, fixing Monday, September 20, 1943, as the time for hearing objections that may be filed to the list of re-assessments prepared by the fiscal officer of the city of Columbus, Ohio, of all due and unpaid special assessments at the close of the June, 1943, collection on delinquent parcels of land within the city which have been certified delinquent three years or more, and

Whereas, said hearing came on September 20, 1943, and no objections were filed with the auditor of the city of Columbus, Ohio; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the special assessments which are due and unpaid at the close of the June, 1943, collection on all delinquent parcels of land in the city of Columbus, Ohio, certified delinquent three years or more and which are contained in a re-assessment report filed in the office of the city clerk and reported to the city council by the fiscal officer on September 20, 1943, be and the same are hereby confirmed and that there be and are hereby levied and re-assessed upon the lots and lands described in said report the several amounts set forth and said special assessments contained in said report shall be re-assessed against the lots or parcels on which the original assessments are found for a period not to exceed ten years from the date of the first installment of said re-assessment, which, by law, shall commence at the tax-paying period immediately following the tax-paying period to which the last installment of the original assessment is due; provided, however, that no re-assessment period is extended longer than fifteen years from the date of said re-assessment.

Sec. 2. That the said re-assessments shall not include any penalties or any interest chargeable under the provisions of section 5704 of the general code of Ohio.

Sec. 3. That the said re-assessments be and the same are hereby ordered certified to the county auditor for collection in the manner provided by law.

Sec. 4. That each re-assessment shall bear interest at the rate of two per cent from the date of said re-assessment, and shall be payable in substantially equal semi-annual installments.

Sec. 5. That the said re-assessments and all portions thereof, when collected, shall be paid into the sinking fund in order to reimburse said sinking fund on account of the retirement of bonds, and interest thereon, which were issued in anticipation of the collection of said special assessments referred to herein.

Sec. 6. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 340-43—To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into a

contract for the purchase of license plates and identification tags necessary for the year 1944.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the city auditor's office in that it is immediately necessary to place an order for said license plates and tags so that same will be on hand January 1, 1944; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for and open bids and enter into a contract for the purchase of license plates and identification tags, in accordance with the specifications on file in the office of said board of purchase.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$3500 or as much thereof as may be needed, be and is hereby appropriated from department No. 21-A, code B-1, to pay the cost thereof.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 341-43—Authorizing the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into a contract for the purchase of license plates and identification tags necessary for the year 1944.

Whereas, it is essential that all license plates and identification tags be on hand by January 1, 1944, and

Whereas it is essential that an order for such plates and such identification tags be placed at once, an emergency has been created in the daily operation of the city auditor's office; now, therefore,

AN ORDINANCE No. 344-43—To authorize the director of public service to enter into an agreement with the Rathbun-Jones Engineering company of Toledo, Ohio, for furnishing the necessary materials and supervision to repair gas engine No. 2, and to ap-

propriate the necessary funds therefor. Whereas, gas engine No. 2 was badly damaged as a result of a connecting rod bearing breaking and allowing the connecting rod to come free while the engine was running and should be repaired as quickly as possible; and,

Whereas, the Rathbun-Jones Engineering company is the manufacturer of said gas engine and is the only company thoroughly familiar with and equipped to do this work; and,

Whereas, the Rathbun-Jones Engineering company has submitted a price of approximately \$2,200 to furnish the necessary parts and supervision to satisfactorily repair said engine; and,

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of sewage treatment, in that it is necessary to make these repairs for the preservation of public health, peace, and property, and safety, now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an agreement with the Rathbun-Jones Engineering company, without advertising for bids, for the services of engineers for supervision and the furnishing of all necessary materials to make the repairs.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$2,200, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated from the division of sewage treatment fund No. 71—300 code, to pay the cost thereof.

Sec. 3. That the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the city treasurer in favor of the Rathbun-Jones Engineering company and said treasurer is authorized and directed to pay the amount of the cost of said work upon receipt of voucher approved by the director of public service.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part thereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 345-43—To authorize the director of public service to enter into contract for repaving the upper terrace at the Gay street entrance to the city hall, and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.
