

pose of constructing and maintaining therein relief, sanitary and storm sewers, including the right to clean and repair same.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of engineering, in that it is necessary to secure rights-of-way for the construction of said sewers in order that same may be done in conformity with the National Recovery Act, public works administration, and for the immediate preservation of public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus (two-thirds of all members elected thereto concurring):

Section 1. That an easement in the following described property be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purpose of constructing and maintaining therein relief, sanitary and storm sewers (contract No. 10, Woodland avenue sanitary sewer, section 1), together with the right to clean and repair the same, to-wit:

Being a strip of land 10 feet in width across a 2.55 acre tract situated in the township of Mifflin, county of Franklin, state of Ohio, as described in deed book 657, page 628, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, the center line of said strip being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning on the west line of Sunbury road at a point 14 feet, more or less, north of the intersection of the west line of Sunbury road and the north line of Woodward avenue, as measured along the said west line of Sunbury road; thence along a line N. 69° 46' W., 158 feet, more or less, to a point; thence along a line 29° 53' right, 142 feet, more or less, to a point on the west line of said 2.55 acre tract, which point is 154 feet, more or less, north of the north line of Woodward avenue as measured along the west line of said 2.55 acre tract; and including the right to use, only during the period of construction of such sewers, additional strips of land along each side thereof, to the extent of 25 feet each way from the center line hereinabove described, except where said 25 feet on each side of said center line would extend outside or beyond the property lines of said tract, in which case said additional strips of land shall extend only to the boundary lines of said tract.

Sec. 2. That the city attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to apply to a court of competent jurisdiction to have a jury impaneled to make inquiry into and assess the compensation to be paid for said easement.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 334-34—To vacate the streets and alleys extending into and through Sunshine park.

Whereas, the city of Columbus is the owner of property known as Sunshine park located south of Sullivant avenue and west of the Scioto river, and

Whereas, certain streets and alleys extend into and through said Sunshine park which are no longer of service to the public and should be vacated, and the public and should be vacated, and

Whereas, council is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacations and that they will not be detrimental to the general interest and should be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That Gift street from Mound street to Sullivant avenue; Banner street from Frank alley to the Scioto river; Willard alley (alley north of Banner street) from Frank alley to the Scioto river; Bellows avenue from Gift street to the Scioto river; Noble alley (alley north of Bellows avenue) from Gift street to McDowell street; alley east of Gift street from Banner

street to Sullivant avenue, and McDowell street from Mound street to Sullivant avenue, be and they are hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 335-34—Authorizing The Columbus Railway, Power and Light company to extend street car terminus on High street, and to widen tracks, and approving increase of street car service on Indianola avenue.

Whereas, The Columbus Railway, Power and Light company is applying to The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio for the consent and authority of said commission to substitute for its present electric suburban or interurban service between the village of Worthington, Ohio and the city of Columbus, Ohio, motor bus service on High street between the north corporation limits of said village of Worthington, Ohio and a point within the city of Columbus at or near Blenheim road, there to connect with the street cars of the High street line of said company; and

Whereas, for the betterment of its street car service on High street north of Oakland Park avenue, it is desirable for said company, as an incident to said substitution of service, to extend the present north terminus of its High street street car line from Oakland Park avenue to a point at or near Blenheim road in said city; and for the betterment of its street car service on Indianola avenue north of Arcadia avenue, to increase the average frequency of its present street car service from a twenty minute frequency to a ten minute frequency; and

Whereas, said substitution of service will enable said The Columbus Railway, Power and Light company to furnish fifteen minute motor bus service between the north corporation line of the city of Columbus and said point at or near Blenheim road; and

Whereas, the extension of said High street street car terminus from Oakland Park avenue to a point at or near Blenheim road necessitates the widening of the present track and trackage of said company between said points from the present gauge of four feet eight and one-half inches to five feet two inches.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus, Ohio:

Section 1. That, subject to the consent and authority of said The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio to said substitution of motor bus service for said electric suburban or interurban service, said The Columbus Railway, Power and Light company be and it is hereby authorized and directed to extend the present north terminus of its High street street car line from Oakland Park avenue to a point at or near Blenheim road, and, at its own cost and expense, to widen said track and trackage between said Oakland Park avenue and a point at or near Blenheim road, from its present gauge of four feet eight and one-half inches to five feet two inches, and for such purpose, to take up and relay, to the satisfaction of the city engineer, so much of the present pavement of High street between said points as may be necessary to the completion of said terminus extension.

Sec. 2. That as an incident to said substitution of motor bus service for said electric suburban or interurban service said The Columbus Railway, Power and Light company be and it is hereby authorized and directed, at its own cost and expense, to remove its street car tracks in High street between said point at or near Blenheim road and the north corporation line of said city, and after such removal to restore the surface of said street to the satisfaction of said city engineer.

Sec. 3. That said increase of street car service on Indianola avenue north of Arcadia avenue and said furnishing of fifteen minute motor bus service on

North High street between the north corporation line of said city and said point at or near Blenheim road, conditioned upon said substitution of motor bus service for said electric suburban or interurban service, be and they are hereby approved.

Sec. 4. That as a necessary incident to the furnishing of said motor bus service, said motor busses may be turned in High street at said High street street car line terminus and at the north corporation line of said city, anything in any other ordinance of the city of Columbus to the contrary notwithstanding.

Sec. 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after the earliest period allowed by law and after said consent and authority of said commission shall have been obtained and filed with this council.

AN ORDINANCE No. 337-34—To authorize the payment of two hundred thirty-three dollars and forty cents for electric service at 2710 Dublin road, consumed from September 24, 1932 to June 26, 1933.

Whereas, on or about the 24th day of September, 1932, the city recreation department discontinued the use of the electric service at the above address, and

Whereas, at that time the service was transferred to a dwelling and shelter house owned by the division of water, and

Whereas, the contract for this service was not signed by the water division until on or about the 10th day of June, 1933; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the payment of \$233.40 be made to the Columbus Railway, Power & Light company for 6456 kilowatt hours consumed from September 24, 1932 to June 26, 1933.

Sec. 2. That the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the city treasurer in the amount of \$233.40 and same is hereby appropriated from the division of water 90-010-C-12 fund.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

RESOLUTIONS

To submit an additional tax levy of two mills for a period of one year for the purpose of raising funds to meet the current expenses of the city of Columbus, Ohio, to a vote of the people at the November, 1934 election.

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Columbus (two-thirds of all members elected thereto concurring):

That the amount of taxes that may be raised by the levy of taxes within the ten mill limitation provided by law will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of the taxing district of the city of Columbus, Ohio, and that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of such limitation for the period of one year at the rate of two mills on each dollar of tax valuation of the taxable property within the city of Columbus, for the purpose of raising funds to meet the current expenses of the taxing district of the city of Columbus, Ohio.

That the form of the ballot shall be as provided in section 5625-17 of the general code of Ohio.

That the city clerk be and he is hereby directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the board of elections of Franklin county, Ohio, prior to September 15, 1934, in order that said board of elections may make arrange-
