AN ORDINANCE No. 338-43—To vacate that portion of Frank alley from the north line, extended, of Willard alley, vacated, to a line 224 feet south of said north line, extended, of said Willard alley.

Whereas, on the 10th day of September, 1943, a petition by the owner of all the land bordering upon the west side of that portion of Frank alley from the north line, extended, of Willard alley, vacated, to a line 224 feet south of said north line, extended, of said Willard alley, was presented to council praying that said portion of said alley be vacated; and

Whereas, the city of Columbus, Ohio, is the owner of the balance of lands and lots abutting upon said portion of Frank alley; and

Whereas, upon hearing, council is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That that portion of Frank alley from the north line, extended, of Willard alley, vacated, to a line 224 feet south of said north line, extended, of said Willard alley, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and other public utilities owned by said city and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any and all other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said portion of said Frank Alley so vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of operating, replacing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
