AN ORDINANCE NO. 34,291—Determining to proceed with the improvement of Eighteenth street, from Columbus street to Reinhard avenue, in the city of Columbus, Ohio.
 Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Eighteenth street, from Columbus street to Reinhard avenue, by grading, draining, curbing, paving the roadway with brick or asphalt, erecting street signs, laying water main, and necessary water services and sewer connections, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, in accordance with the resolution declaring it necessary to improve the same adopted by council March 26, 1923; and in accordance with the plans, profiles, specifications and estimate of cost therefor approved and now on file in the office of the department of public service.

Sec. 2. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after completion of the proposed improvement, and the city attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Sec. 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, together with interest on bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessment to be levied for said improvement and all other necessary expenditures, less one-fiftieth thereof and the cost of intersections, shall be assessed in proportion to the special benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands to-wit: All lots and lands fronting, bounding or abutting upon the proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and in an amount to be determined.

Sec. 4. That the sum of \$2,500.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the street improvement and intersection fund, to pay the remainder of the cost of said improvement.

Sec. 5. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in eight annual installments with interest on deferred payments at a rate not exceeding six per cent per annum; provided that the owner of any property assessed may, at his option, pay such assessment or any number of installments thereof, at any time after said assessment has been levied, with interest to the semi-annual interest day of said bonds next following date of payment.

Sec. 6. That bonds of the city of Columbus, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by installments, and in an amount equal thereto.

Sec. 7. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to construct said water main by the direct employment of labor and the board of purchase to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the material necessary for constructing said water main.

Sec. 8. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to make and execute contract for the remainder of said improvement with the lowest and best bidder after advertising according to law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 34,292—Determining to proceed with the improvement of Gates street, from High street to Park street south, in the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Gates street, from High street to Park street south, by grading, draining, curbing, paving the roadway with brick or asphalt, and laying the necessary water services and sewer connections, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, in accordance with the resolution declaring it necessary to improve the same adopted by council April 2, 1923; and in accordance with the plans, profiles, specifications and estimate of cost therefor approved and now on file in the office of the department of public service.

Sec. 2. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after completion of the proposed improvement, and the city attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Sec. 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, together with interest on bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessment to be levied for said improvement and all other necessary expenditures, less one-fiftieth thereof and the cost of intersections, shall be assessed in proportion to the special benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All lots and lands fronting, bounding or abutting upon the proposed improvement, and lots 99 to 126, both inclusive, MacLaughlin place, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and in an amount to be determined.

Sec. 4. That the sum of \$1500.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the street improvement and intersection fund, to pay the remainder of the cost of said improvement.

Sec. 5. AN ORDINANCE NO. 34,293—Appropriating money for cast iron pipe for the division of water, department of public service.

Whereas, There is an urgent demand for the smaller sizes of cast iron pipe and the pipe foundries are making very slow deliveries on these sizes, and

Whereas, Many streets are now being improved which require the installation of water mains and many new houses are without water for domestic use and fire protection, and the purchase of pipe for immediate delivery is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and

to contract for 50 tons of cast iron pipe.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$3500, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated from the main line extension fund No. 13, to pay the cost of said pipe.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 34,294—To authorize the purchase of the property herein described for the opening and extending of City Park avenue from a point 210.54 feet south of Hanford street to a point 153 feet north of Moler street, and appropriating the money therefor.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to purchase the following property for the opening and extending of City Park avenue from a point 210.54 feet south of Hanford street to a point 153 feet north of Moler street:
 First Parcel:

Situated in the county of Franklin, state of Ohio, city of Columbus and being a tract or parcel of land 50 feet wide, situated in and being a part of lot No. 7 of N. Merion's amended subdivision in half section 29, township 5, range 22, refuge lands, as of record in plat book No. 1, page 96, Franklin county plat records, and described as follows: Beginning at a point in the west line of City Park avenue at a point 210.54 feet south of the south line of Hanford street, said point being the south-east corner of lot No. 9 in Koch's subdivision (as of record in plat book 5, page 66, Franklin county plat records); thence southwardly with the west line of said City Park avenue extended south, 62.50 feet more or less to the north line of lot No. 5 of Loechler's subdivision of record in plat book 2, page 355, Franklin county plat records; thence eastwardly with the north line of said lot No. 5, Loechler's subdivision and the same extended eastwardly 50 feet to a point; thence northwardly and parallel to the first described line and 50 feet distant eastwardly therefrom, being the east line of City Park avenue in said Koch's subdivision produced southwardly, 62.50 feet more or less to the south line of said Koch's subdivision; thence westwardly with the south line of said subdivision to the place of beginning; from the owner or owners thereof and any other person or persons having an interest therein for the sum of \$200.00, free and clear of all incumbrances whatsoever except taxes for the year 1923 and thereafter.

Loechler's subdivision, as of record in plat book 2, page 355, Franklin county plat records; the west line of said 45.40 foot parcel is the west line of City Park avenue as shown on Koch's subdivision (of record in plat book 5, page 66, Franklin county plat records) produced southwardly in a straight line through said lot No. 5; from the owner or owners thereof and any other person or persons having an interest therein for the sum of \$700.00, free and clear of all incumbrances whatsoever except taxes for the year 1923 and thereafter.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$987.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated from the City Park avenue opening and extension fund for the payment of the consideration for said parcels, which consideration shall be paid on voucher signed by the director of public service after approval by the city attorney of the title and deeds therefor; and for the payment of any taxes and assessments thereon to be paid by said city, which said taxes and

assessments, if any, shall be paid on voucher signed by the city attorney; and for the transfer and recording of said deeds, which transfer and recording shall be paid on voucher signed by the city clerk.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 34,295—Appropriating money from the rotating fund as established by ordinance No. 32,697.

Whereas, An emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service in that it is necessary to provide funds at once for the improvement of Grubb street, from Scott street to Sullivant avenue, in order that the same may be completed at the earliest possible time; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the sum of thirty-two thousand dollars for the payment of the property owners' portion of the improvement of Grubb street, from Scott street to Sullivant avenue, be and the same is hereby appropriated from the rotating fund established by ordinance No. 32,697 to pay the cost of the property owners' portion of said improvement.

Sec. 2. That bonds for the property owners' portion shall be issued and sold at the earliest possible time and the proceeds thereof shall be used to reimburse the said rotating fund.

Sec. 3. For the reason stated in the preamble hereof this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 34,296—To provide for the issue and sale of bonds in the sum of \$25,000 for the purpose of raising additional funds to pay the cost of permanently repairing, reconstructing and replacing public property and public ways injured by the floods occurring in March and April, 1913, and of widening, deepening and straightening the Olentangy and Scioto rivers within the city of Columbus and of procuring the necessary real estate therefor, for the purpose of protecting public property and public ways and private property and lives from a recurrence of the damage caused by the said rivers overflowing their banks during the floods of March and April, 1913, under authority of an act of the general assembly, passed April 10, 1913, and amended April 28, 1913.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That to raise additional money to pay the cost and expense of permanently repairing, reconstructing and replacing public property and public ways injured by the floods occurring in March and April, 1913, and of widening, deepening and straightening the Olentangy and Scioto rivers within the city of Columbus and of procuring the necessary real estate therefor, for the purpose of protecting public property and public ways and private property and lives from a recurrence of the damage caused by the said rivers overflowing their banks during the floods of March and April, 1913, it is hereby declared necessary to issue and there shall be issued bonds of said city of Columbus in the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the mayor and auditor, bear date not later than October 1, 1923, and shall be numbered and be due and payable as follows:

Said bonds shall be of the denomination of \$1000 each, shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of May and November of each year and for which the proper interest coupons bearing a fac simile of the signature of the auditor shall be attached to and made a part of said bonds. Principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the treasurer of the city of Columbus.

It is hereby stated and recited that the final tax settlement between the county treasurer and the city of Columbus next following the inclusion of a tax for the issue of the bonds herein provided for in the annual budget as provided by law, will take place in August, 1925.

Sec. 3. For the purpose of providing the necessary funds to pay interest on the foregoing issue of bonds, promptly when and as the same falls due, and also to provide a fund sufficient to discharge the said serial bonds at maturity, there shall be and is hereby levied on all the taxable property in the city of Columbus, in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually during the period said bonds are to run, in an amount sufficient to provide funds to pay interest upon said bonds as and when the same falls due, and also to provide a fund for the discharge of the principal of said serial bonds at maturity, which tax shall not be less than the interest and sinking fund tax required by Section II of article XII of the constitution.

Said tax shall be and is hereby ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officers, in the same manner and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of said years are certified, extended and collected. Said tax shall be placed hereof and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof. The funds derived from said tax levies hereby required, shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which, together with the interest collected on the same, shall be irrevocably pledged for the payment of principal and interest of said bonds when and as the same fall due.

Sec. 4. The city auditor is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this ordinance to the auditor of Franklin county, Ohio, in accordance with the provisions of Section 5649-1b of the general code of Ohio.

Sec. 5. The committee on finance of this council is hereby directed to have said bonds and coupons properly prepared and executed, to sell the same and to deposit the proceeds in the city treasury in a fund to be designated as flood protection improvement fund No. 2. Said bonds shall bear on their face the description "flood protection improvement bond" and it shall be stated thereon that they are issued under authority of the act of the general assembly, passed April 10, 1913, (103 O. L. 141), and amended April 28, 1913, (103 O. L. 760).

Sec. 6. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Whereas, An emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of public welfare, subdivision of public charities in that it is necessary to immediately provide suitable quarters for the subdivision of public charities so that the same may begin its operations at once; now, therefore,

That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized to purchase the necessary materials and the director of public service to employ the necessary labor for the building of partitions and otherwise arranging the second floor of the building known as 82 West Broad street in said city in order to provide suitable quarters for the subdivision of public charities.

Sec. 2. That from the moneys now in the fund known as the general fund and from all moneys estimated to come into said fund from any and all sources during the balance of the twelve months ending December 31, 1923, and not otherwise appropriated, there be and there hereby is appropriated the sum of \$250.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose aforesaid, said sum to be paid out upon order of the director of public service.
